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3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
4	SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, the
5	support of public school activities by the State Board of Education
6	payable from monies appropriated and authorized by Enrolled House
7	Bill No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature
8	shall be apportioned as follows:

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1	SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, the State
2	Board of Education shall budget all funds in the following
3	categories and amounts:

13	The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for
14	each budget category.
15	SECTION 3. The funds appropriated in Sections 13 and 14 of
16	Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma
17	Legislature in the amount of Three Million Eight Hundred Twenty-
18	seven Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$3,827,899.00)
19	shall be transferred to the School Consolidation Assistance Fund.
20	SECTION 4. The funds appropriated in Sections 15 and 16 of
21	Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma
22	Legislature in the amount of Three Million Eight Hundred Twenty-
23	seven Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$3,827,899.00)
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shall be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System Dedicated
 Revenue Revolving Fund.

3 SECTION 5. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act 4 specifically for the purpose of funding the Teachers' Retirement 5 Credit shall be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System of 6 Oklahoma.

SECTION 6. If the funds allocated in Section 1 of this act 7 specifically for the purpose of funding the Teachers' Retirement 8 9 Credit are insufficient to fully fund the employee contribution 10 credits provided for in Section 17-108.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma 11 Statutes as invoiced by the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma, 12 the Department may reduce in equal proportions funds allocated in 13 Section 1 of this act to Education Leadership Oklahoma, Advanced Placement Incentives, Reading Sufficiency, Teacher and Leader 14 Effectiveness Programs, Alternative and High Challenge Education, 15 Required Assessments, Ag in the Classroom and Imagine Math. Total 16 17 amount of funds reduced shall not exceed the additional amount required to fully fund the employee contribution credits. 18

SECTION 7. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for the purpose of funding Education Leadership Oklahoma shall be expended as follows:

One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00)
 shall be transferred to the Oklahoma National Board Certification
 Revolving Fund created in Section 6-204.4 of Title 70 of the

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Oklahoma Statutes for the purpose of awarding annual bonuses as
 directed; and

2. Three Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,300,000.00)
shall be transferred to the Oklahoma School Psychologist, Speechlanguage Pathologist, and Audiologist National Certification
Revolving Fund created in Section 6-206.1 of Title 70 of the
Oklahoma Statutes for the purpose of awarding annual bonuses as
directed.

9 SECTION 8. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
10 Advanced Placement Incentives shall be expended for the purpose of
11 providing assistance for students in financial need, grants to
12 districts wanting to start new AP programs and expand professional
13 development, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1210.703 of Title
14 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 9. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Reading Sufficiency shall be expended pursuant to the provisions of Section 1210.508D of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

18 SECTION 10. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for 19 Teacher and Leader Effectiveness shall be expended for the purpose 20 of improving the effectiveness of teachers and leaders in the public 21 school system through continued development, pursuant to Section 6-22 101.16 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

23 SECTION 11. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for 24 Required Assessments shall be expended for the purpose of

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administering a statewide student assessment system for grades three
 through eight and in high school, pursuant to Section 1210.508 of
 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 12. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
Alternative and High Challenge Education shall be expended for the
purpose of operating the statewide system of alternative education
programs as provided in Section 1210.568 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
Statutes, and for encouraging school districts to participate in
innovative alternative education programs.

SECTION 13. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for 10 11 the Teacher Induction Program shall be expended pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-195 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 12 13 SECTION 14. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Early Intervention shall be transferred to the Early Intervention 14 15 Fund 250. It is the intent of the Legislature that funding available for SoonerStart Early Intervention Services be expended 16 17 for direct services to eligible infants, toddlers and their The State Department of Education shall not contract, pay 18 families. or reimburse for administrative cost recovery personnel, accounting 19 and management information system costs, maintenance and operations 20 at the state or local level or indirect costs which do not comply 21 with the requirements of Section 13-125 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma 22 Statutes. 23

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SECTION 15. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
 the Early Childhood Initiative shall be expended for the purpose of
 funding the early childhood program pursuant to the provisions of
 Section 10-105.4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5 SECTION 16. The duties and compensation of employees, not 6 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed 7 upon the State Department of Education by law shall be set by the 8 State Board of Education.

9 SECTION 17. State Aid funds shall be reduced or withheld by the 10 State Board of Education in an amount necessary to ensure compliance 11 with the provisions of this act.

12 SECTION 18. The State Board of Education is authorized to 13 request the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to transfer 14 appropriated funds to the appropriate dispensing fund.

SECTION 19. The Superintendent of the State Board of Education may request through the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the Education Reform Revolving Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Board's disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

21 SECTION 20. If funds appropriated in Sections 1 through 16 of 22 Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature are 23 not sufficient to fully fund the provisions of this act, each school 24 district which qualifies for funds, excluding Financial Support of

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Public Schools, pursuant to the provisions of this act shall take a
 proportionate reduction.

3 SECTION 21. A. The Superintendent of the State Board of 4 Education may request, in the manner provided in this section, that 5 receipt and expenditure of unanticipated federal funds awarded after 6 July 1, 2021, be exempt from expenditure limitations and from 7 budgetary limitations.

8 1. The Superintendent shall make a request for exemption to the 9 Office of Management and Enterprise Services in writing and file a 10 revised budget program.

The Superintendent shall also file copies of the request for 11 2. 12 exemption and budget work program revisions with the House of Representatives Appropriations and Budget Committee Chair and the 13 Senate Appropriations Committee Chair. The House Appropriations and 14 Budget Committee Chair and/or the Senate Appropriations Committee 15 Chair shall notify the Office of Management and Enterprise Services 16 of any noncompliance of the request with legislative intent within 17 twelve (12) calendar days of their receipt of the exemption request. 18

B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall approve the request for exemption unless both the Chair and Vice Chair of the Joint Legislative Committee on Budget and Program Oversight provide written notification to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services within twelve (12) calendar days of the Committee's receipt of the exemption request that the exemption

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subverts the intention and objectives of the Legislature in establishing the original limit. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall give written notice of approval or disapproval of each exemption to the agency, the Governor, the Chair of the House Appropriations and Budget Committee and the Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee within eighteen (18) calendar days of receiving the request.

SECTION 22. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 8 9 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, not including 10 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (hereafter FY-22) or may be 11 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 (hereafter FY-23). 12 Funds budgeted for FY-22 may be encumbered only through June 30, 13 2022, and must be expended by November 15, 2022. Any funds 14 remaining after November 15, 2022, and not budgeted for FY-23, shall 15 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal 16 year. Funds budgeted for FY-23 may be encumbered only through June 17 30, 2023. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2023, shall lapse 18 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. 19 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years 20 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-22, and not required to pay 21 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-23, after 22 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared 23 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds 24

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1	from the FY-22 budget work program and after such revision has been
2	approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
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
