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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9100 of Title 74, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. There is hereby created, until December 1, 2022, the Unified
20	State Law Enforcement Commission. The Commission shall be composed
21	of the following eight (8) members:
22	1. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety or
23	designee;
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2. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation
 or designee;

3 3. The Director of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and4 Dangerous Drugs Control or designee;

5 4. The Cabinet Secretary of Public Safety or designee;

6 5. The Oklahoma Attorney General or designee;

7 6. One member selected by the Governor, who shall serve as the8 chair of the Commission;

9 7. One member designated by the President Pro Tempore of the10 State Senate who shall be a current member of the Senate; and

8. One member designated by the Speaker of the House of
Representatives who shall be a current member of the House of
Representatives.

B. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the
purpose of conducting the business of the Commission. The
Commission shall meet monthly and at such other times as may be
called by the chair.

C. Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for serving on the Commission but shall receive travel reimbursement for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

Study, evaluate and make recommendations regarding
 unification of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the
 Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, and the
 Department of Public Safety;

5 2. Study, evaluate and make recommendations regarding a
6 recruitment, training and leadership development program for members
7 of a unified state law enforcement agency that will enhance the
8 efforts of the state to recruit, lead and retain highly qualified
9 state law enforcement officers;

3. Study, evaluate and make recommendations regarding how best to ensure accountability within a unified state law enforcement agency and to address public corruption; and

4. Study, evaluate and make recommendations regarding any other matters determined by the Commission to be relevant to the purpose of this act.

E. The Commission shall prepare a report of its findings and recommendations to be submitted to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the State Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Chair of the Public Safety Committees in both the State Senate and the House of Representatives, and the minority leaders of both the State Senate and the House of Representatives no later than December 1, 2021.

F. Staffing for the Commission shall be provided by the StateSenate.
