18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 85.44F of Title 74, unless there			
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
22	A. As used in this section:			
23	1. "Ammunition" means a loaded cartridge or shot shell, case,			
24	primer, projectile, wadding, or propellant powder;			

2. "Company" means a for-profit organization, association,
 corporation, partnership, joint venture, limited partnership,
 limited liability partnership, or limited liability company
 including a wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary,
 parent company, or an affiliate of those entities or associations
 that exists to make a profit. The term does not include a sole
 proprietorship;

8 3. "Discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade
9 association" means, with respect to the entity or association, to:

a. refuse to engage in the trade of any goods or services
with the entity or association based solely on its
status as a firearm entity or firearm trade
association,

b. refrain from continuing an existing business
relationship with the entity or association based
solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm
trade association, or

c. terminate an existing business relationship with the
 entity or association based solely on its status as a
 firearm entity or firearm trade association.

The term does not include the policies of a vendor, merchant, retail seller, or platform that restrict or prohibit the listing or selling of ammunition, firearms, or firearm accessories. The term also does not include a company's refusal to engage in the trade of any goods

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1 or services, decision to refrain from continuing an existing business relationship, or decision to terminate an existing business 2 relationship to comply with federal, state, or local laws, policies, 3 4 or regulations or a directive by a regulatory agency, or for any 5 traditional business reason that is specific to the customer or potential customer and not based solely on the status of an entity 6 7 or association as a firearm entity or firearm trade association; 4. "Firearm" means a weapon that expels a projectile by the 8 9 action of explosive or expanding gases;

10 5. "Firearm accessory" means a device specifically designed or 11 adapted to enable an individual to wear, carry, store, or mount a 12 firearm on the individual or on a conveyance and an item used in 13 conjunction with or mounted on a firearm that is not essential to 14 the basic function of the firearm. The term includes a detachable 15 firearm magazine;

16 6. "Firearm

"Firearm entity" means:

a. a firearm, firearm accessory, or firearm ammunition
 manufacturer, distributor, wholesaler, supplier, or
 retailer, and

20 b. a gun range;

21 7. "Firearm trade association" means any person, corporation, 22 unincorporated association, federation, business league, or business 23 organization that:

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1 is not organized or operated for profit and for which a. 2 none of its net earnings inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, 3

has two or more firearm entities as members, and 5 с. is exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as an 6

7 organization described by Section 501(c) of that code; 8. "Governmental entity" means any branch, department, agency, 8 9 or instrumentality of state government, or any official or other person acting under color of state law, or any political subdivision 10 11 of this state; and

12 "Sole-source provider" means a supplier who provides goods 9. 13 or services of a unique nature or goods or services that are solely 14 available through the supplier and the supplier is the only 15 practicable source to provide such goods or services.

16 Β. The provisions of this section shall apply only to a 17 contract that:

18 Is between a governmental entity and a company with at least 1. 19 ten (10) full-time employees; and

20 2. Has a value of at least One Hundred Thousand Dollars 21 (\$100,000.00) that is paid wholly or partly from public funds of the 22 governmental entity.

23 C. Except as provided by subsection D of this section, a governmental entity shall not enter into a contract with a company 24

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b.

1 for the purchase of goods or services unless the contract contains a
2 written verification from the company that it:

3 1. Does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive 4 that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade 5 association; and

6 2. Will not discriminate during the term of the contract7 against a firearm entity or firearm trade association.

8 D. The provisions of subsection C of this section shall not9 apply to a governmental entity that:

10 1. Contracts with a sole-source provider; or

11 2. After requesting bids, only receives bids from companies 12 that do not comply with the provisions of subsection C of this 13 section.

14 The Central Purchasing Division of the Office of Management Ε. 15 and Enterprise Services shall have the authority and responsibility 16 of reviewing state governmental contracts to confirm that the 17 requirements of subsection C of this section have been satisfied. 18 SECTION 2.
