8 An Act relating to public health; creating the No
9 Patient Left Alone Act; providing for minor and adult
10 patients to designate a visitor with unrestricted
11 visitation; prohibiting termination, suspension, or
12 waiver of visitation rights by certain parties;
13 providing certain limitations; prohibiting hospitals
14 from requiring patient waiver of certain rights;
15 requiring posting of certain informational materials;
16 providing for codification; and providing an
17 effective date.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-706a of Title 63, unless there
21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "No Patient Left
23 Alone Act".

24 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-706b of Title 63, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. Subject to the provisions of subsection D of this section,
2 each minor who is admitted to a hospital licensed pursuant to
3 Section 1-702 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes has the right to
4 have a parent, guardian, or person standing in loco parentis who
5 shall have the unrestricted privilege of being present while the
6 minor patient is receiving hospital care.

7 B. Subject to the provisions of subsection D of this section,
8 each adult who is admitted to a hospital licensed pursuant to
9 Section 1-702 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes has the right to
10 designate a spouse, family member, or friend who shall have the
11 unrestricted privilege of being present while the adult patient is
12 receiving hospital care.

13 C. The rights specified in this section may not be terminated,
14 suspended, or waived by the hospital, the State Department of
15 Health, or any governmental entity, notwithstanding declarations of
16 emergency declared by the Governor or the Legislature.

17 D. Hospitals may require visitors to wear personal protective
18 equipment, provided that any such required equipment shall be
19 provided by the hospital. Nothing in this section shall be
20 construed to require a hospital to allow a visitor to enter an
21 operating room or other typically restricted area or to remain
22 present during the administration of emergency care in critical
23 situations.

1 E. No hospital licensed pursuant to Section 1-702 of Title 63
2 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall require a patient to waive the rights
3 specified in this section.

4 F. Each hospital licensed pursuant to Section 1-702 of Title 63
5 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall post in a conspicuous place on the
6 licensed premises informational materials developed by the State
7 Department of Health explaining the rights specified in this
8 section.

9 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
