11	An Act relating to school curriculum; directing the State Department of Education in certain consultation
12	to develop resources related to Holocaust education for students in certain grades; requiring Holocaust
13	education be taught in public schools beginning in certain school year; allowing Holocaust education to
14	be integrated in courses; directing the State Department of Education to develop certain
15	professional learning opportunities; defining term; providing for codification; providing an effective
16	date; and declaring an emergency.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.60 of Title 70, unless
21	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	A. The State Department of Education, in consultation with
23	experts in Holocaust education, shall develop and make available to

public schools resources related to Holocaust education for grade appropriate instruction of students in grades six through twelve.

B. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, Holocaust education
shall be taught to students in grades six through twelve in public
schools in this state, as prescribed in the Oklahoma Academic
Standards. Holocaust education may be integrated into one or more
existing courses of study and shall be taught in a manner that:

8 1. Generates an understanding of the causes, course, and9 effects of the Holocaust;

Develops dialogue with students on the ramifications of
 bullying, bigotry, stereotyping, and discrimination; and

Encourages tolerance of diversity and reverence for human
 dignity for all citizens in a pluralistic society.

14 C. The State Department of Education, in consultation with 15 experts in Holocaust education, shall develop and implement high 16 quality professional learning opportunities for Holocaust education 17 teachers.

D. As used in this section, "Holocaust" means the systematic, state-sponsored persecution and attempted annihilation of Jews and other groups by the Nazi regime in Germany between 1933 and 1945, which resulted in the murder of approximately six million Jews and five million other individuals.

23 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
