10	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
11	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Science and
12	Technology Research and Development Board; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5060.6, which relates to board
13	of directors; modifying membership of board; appointing chair; specifying member to serve at the placeurs of the appointing outboritus aposifying
14	pleasure of the appointing authority; specifying quorum; and providing an effective date.
15	
16	
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5060.6, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 5060.6 A. The board of directors for the Oklahoma
21	Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology (OCAST) is
22	hereby reconstituted as the Oklahoma Science and Technology Research
23	(OSTRaD) and Development (OSTRaD) Board shall consist of nine (9)
24	members and shall be comprised as follows:

1	1. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce Four
2	members appointed by the Governor, one of whom represents the
3	University of Oklahoma and one of whom represents Oklahoma State
4	University, with the advice and consent of the Senate;
5	2. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
6	Education Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
7	<pre>Senate;</pre>
8	3. The president of the University of Oklahoma Two members
9	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
10	4. The president of Oklahoma State University;
11	5. The president of one of the regional universities in The
12	State System of Higher Education designated by the Chancellor;
13	6. The president of a private Oklahoma university classified by
14	the Carnegie Foundation as a national doctorate-granting institution
15	offering graduate engineering degrees to be appointed by the
16	Governor;
17	7. The Governor's appointed cabinet Secretary of Agriculture;
18	8. A member of the House of Representatives, who shall serve as
19	an ex officio nonvoting member, appointed by the Speaker of the
20	House of Representatives;
21	9. A member of the Senate, who shall serve as an ex officio
22	nonvoting member, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
23	Senate;

1	10. Two members, appointed by the Governor, who shall be
2	engineers or scientists with extensive experience in managing basic
3	or applied scientific or technological research at Oklahoma
4	institutions of higher education, who shall serve terms of four (4)
5	years; provided that, the two members who possess these
6	qualifications and are serving on the board of directors of the
7	Center on July 1, 2002, shall fill these positions on the Oklahoma
8	Science and Technology Research and Development Board for initial
9	terms to expire on June 30, 2003;
10	11. Five members appointed by the Governor who are or who have
11	served as chief executive officers or senior executive officers of
12	corporations engaged in information technology, biotechnology,
13	genetics, other emerging technologies, agriculture, oil and natural
14	gas, early stage high risk venture capital finance, other
15	significant Oklahoma industries, or Oklahoma industries that are
16	potentially significant to the state economy or who are or who have
17	served as chief executive officers or senior executive officers of a
18	private nonprofit organization or who are or who have served as
19	chief executive officers or senior executive officers of foundations
20	with a history of supporting research and development. Two members
21	appointed pursuant to this paragraph shall serve initial terms to
22	expire on June 30, 2005, and two shall serve initial terms to expire
23	on June 30, 2006. For the position for which the initial
24	

1 appointment begins after July 1, 2005, the initial term shall expire
2 on June 30, 2009;

3 12. Four members appointed by the Governor who represent small business. One appointee shall serve an initial term to expire on June 30, 2005, and one shall serve an initial term to expire on June 30, 2006. For the two positions for which the initial appointments begin after July 1, 2005, one appointee shall serve an initial term to expire on June 30, 2008, and one appointee shall serve an initial 9 term to expire on June 30, 2009;

10 13. One member appointed by the Governor who represents rural 11 Oklahoma. The initial appointee shall serve a term to expire on 12 June 30, 2004; and

13 14. Until June 30, 2004, or vacation of the offices, six 14 members who, before the effective date of this act, were appointed 15 by the Governor and who are serving on the board of directors of 16 OCAST on July 1, 2002. These positions on the Oklahoma Science and 17 Technology Research and Development Board shall cease to exist on 18 June 30, 2004, or when the position is vacated if the vacancy occurs 19 prior to June 30, 2004. A member of the OCAST board who holds one 20 of these positions may be appointed to a position described in 21 paragraphs 9 through 12 of this subsection on the Oklahoma Science 22 and Technology Research and Development Board if the member meets 23 the qualifications for such position.

B. The two legislatively appointed members of the Board shall
 be persons of demonstrated knowledge of and commitment to the
 advancement of science and technology in Oklahoma and shall serve at
 the pleasure of their respective appointing authority Secretary of
 Science and Innovation.

B. The Secretary of Science and Innovation, or a designee of the Governor, shall serve as chair.

8 C. In making appointments to the Oklahoma Science and 9 Technology Research and Development Board, appropriate consideration 10 shall be given to representation upon the Board by race, gender and 11 geographical area.

12 D. Gubernatorial appointees appointed after July 1, 2002, shall 13 serve four-year terms except for initial terms as provided in this 14 section. Terms shall expire on June 30. All gubernatorial 15 appointees shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate. Except 16 as otherwise provided in this section, any vacancy in board 17 positions filled by appointment of the Governor shall be filled for 18 the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment 19 With the exception of the Secretary of Science and Innovation, all 20 members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authority. 21 Ε. The Board shall elect, annually, a chair who shall be from 22 the private sector membership of the Board. A vice-chair shall be 23 elected annually from among all the members of the Board. Persons

1 elected to the position of chair or vice-chair shall not serve more 2 than two consecutive terms in said position. 3 F. The Board shall meet at least once each calendar guarter and at such other times: 4 5 1. Upon call of the chair; 6 Upon call of the chief executive officer of the Center 2. 7 OSTRaD or the Institute; or 3. Upon written request of a majority of the board members. 8 9 G. A majority of the F. Five voting members of the Board shall 10 constitute a quorum. A quorum of the Board shall be necessary to 11 transact business. All actions of the board members shall be made 12 by a majority of the quorum present. A board member appointed 13 pursuant to paragraphs 3, 4, 5 or 6 of subsection A of this section 14 may send a predetermined designee as a representative to board 15 meetings who may participate with full voting privileges. All other 16 board members may send a predetermined designee as a representative 17 to board meetings who may vote; provided, the designee may vote at 18 no more than thirty percent (30%) of meetings during a fiscal year. 19 H. Members of the Board shall be entitled to compensation and 20 expenses as may be provided in the charter or bylaws of the Board. 21 The members of the Board shall not be subject to the dual-G. 22 office-holding prohibitions set forth in Section 6 of Title 51 of 23 the Oklahoma Statutes.

1	I. The Board shall establish an executive committee composed of
2	the chair, vice-chair, and three (3) additional voting members
3	chosen by the chair from among the remaining board members. The
4	executive committee, in intervals between board meetings, may
5	transact any board business that has been delegated to the executive
6	committee. A majority of the executive committee shall be necessary
7	to transact business and all actions of the executive committee
8	shall be by a majority vote of the committee.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
