8	An Act relating to schools; amending Section 1, Chapter 333, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section
9 10	24-100.7), which relates to suicide awareness and drug abuse policies; requiring rather than allowing school district boards of education to adopt certain
11	policy; requiring boards of education to provide certain staff training; directing certain curriculum
12	be made available to staff; requiring school districts to provide certain training and curriculum
13	beginning in certain school year; allowing certain training of students in certain grades beginning in certain school year; providing an effective date; and
14	declaring an emergency.

17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 333, O.S.L.
19	2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 24-100.7), is amended to read as
20	follows:
21	Section 24-100.7. A. The board of education of each school
22	district in this state may shall adopt a policy regarding suicide
23	awareness and training, requiring staff training and the reporting
24	of student drug abuse.

1 The board of education of each school district in this state В. 2 may shall provide schoolwide district-wide training to all students 3 in grades seven through twelve and staff addressing suicide awareness and prevention. The Department of Mental Health and 4 5 Substance Abuse Services shall develop and make available to school districts curriculum for staff which addresses suicide awareness and 6 prevention, without cost to the school districts. The course 7 outline for the curriculum shall be made available to the public 8 9 online through the school district website. Beginning with the 10 2014-2015 2021-2022 school year, every school district may shall: 1. Provide a suicide prevention training program which includes 11 12 as a core element research-based evidence-based approaches and that is developed by the school district; 13 2. Provide the curriculum made available by the Department of 14 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; or 15 3. Provide a suicide prevention training program that is 16 selected by the school district from a list maintained by the 17 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to students 18 and school district staff that addresses suicide awareness and 19 prevention. The training program may be combined with any other 20 training provided by the school district addressing bullying 21 prevention. 22

C. <u>Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, the board of</u>
education of each school district may provide training to address

1 suicide awareness and prevention to students in grades seven through
2 twelve.

<u>D.</u> Teachers, counselors, principals, administrators and other school personnel shall be immune from employment discipline and any civil liability for:

Calling the 911 emergency telephone number, law enforcement
or the Department of Human Services if they believe a student poses
a threat to themselves or others or if a student has committed or
been the victim of a violent act or threat of a violent act;

Providing referral, emergency medical care or other
 assistance offered in good faith to a student or other youth; or

3. Communicating information in good faith concerning drug or alcohol abuse or a potential safety threat by or to any student to the parents or legal guardians of the student, law enforcement officers or health care providers.

16 D. E. No person shall have a cause of action for any loss or
17 damage caused by any act or omission resulting from the
18 implementation of this section or resulting from any training, or
19 lack thereof, required by this section, unless the loss or damage
20 was caused by willful or wanton misconduct.

21 E. F. The training required pursuant to this section, or the 22 lack thereof, shall not be construed to impose any specific duty of 23 care.

F. G. School districts may enter into agreements with
 designated Youth Services Agencies for the provision of intervention
 and prevention services.

4 G. H. Teachers, counselors, principals, administrators τ or 5 other school personnel, upon determining that a student is at risk of attempting suicide, shall notify the parents or legal guardians 6 7 of the student immediately upon determining that such risk exists. SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021. 8 9 SECTION 3.
