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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:					
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified					
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 85.45j.11 of Title 74, unless					
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:					
18	A. There is hereby created the "Oklahoma Supplier Diversity					
19	Initiative", which shall be a state-sponsored supplier diversity					
20	program to provide a resource for state agencies and private					
21	businesses to utilize diverse firms in procurement opportunities to					
22	encourage growth in the economy of the state. The program shall					
23	provide convenience for qualified and certified small business					
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enterprises and minority business enterprises in contracting
 projects in underserved areas.

B. The program shall allow diverse business enterprises to
register with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and
allow registered vendors to be automatically notified of
opportunities to do business with the state for specific
commodities. The program shall provide for simplified vendor
registration processes.

9 C. The program shall authorize the Oklahoma Department of 10 Commerce to develop a diversity certification program to qualify and 11 certify diverse business enterprises for the state.

D. To qualify for the program, businesses shall have less than five hundred total employees, an annual revenue equal to or less than Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000.00) and be certified as one of the following:

An Oklahoma Department of Transportation Disadvantaged
 Business Enterprise;

18 2. Any of the following entities certified by the United States19 Small Business Administration:

20 a. Woman-Owned Small Business,

- 21 b. Minority-Business Enterprise,
- 22 c. Small Disadvantaged Business,
- 23 d. Service-disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business,
- e. HUBZone Small Business Concern, and

A Native American-owned Business; or A Veteran-owned Business. 3 4. 4 The Central Purchasing Division of the Office of Management Ε. 5 and Enterprise Services shall: 6 Amend the vendor registration process to require diversity 1. 7 certification check off and size standard information; 2. Create a search tool for all state agencies and public or 8 9 private entities to utilize to obtain contact information for 10 diverse firms for the purpose of promoting procurement opportunities 11 within the state; and 12 3. Develop a supplier-diversity-inclusion index to measure utilization of certified firms and related economic impact to the 13 14 state within one (1) year of authorization of the program. 15 F. On or before September 1 of each year, the State Purchasing 16 Director shall submit a report to the Governor, the Speaker of the 17 House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate 18 on the status of the percentile of state funds expended on contracts 19 awarded to minority businesses in the preceding fiscal year and 20 provide any report, statistics or other information concerning the 21 participation in the program to the Office of Management and 22 Enterprise Services. 23

G. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall promulgate rules
 to create and administer the Oklahoma Supplier Diversity Initiative.
