7 An Act relating to the Department of Mental Health  
8 and Substance Abuse Services; requiring that portions  
9 of certain appropriated funds be used for certain  
10 purposes; creating pilot programs; authorizing  
11 request for early transfers of certain funds for  
specific purpose; providing for lapse of funds under  
certain conditions; requiring certain budget  
procedures; and prohibiting certain budget  
procedures.

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14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
16 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
17 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
18 sum of One Million Five Hundred Forty-one Thousand Two Hundred  
19 Fifty-two Dollars (\$1,541,252.00) shall be used for program growth.

20 SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
21 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
22 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
23 sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be used to  
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1 carry out the provisions of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 848 of the 1st  
2 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature.

3 SECTION 3. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
4 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
5 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
6 sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be used to carry  
7 out the provisions of Enrolled House Bill No. 2877 of the 1st  
8 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature.

9 SECTION 4. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
10 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
11 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
12 agency shall increase the amount of crisis intervention training  
13 sessions offered to members of law enforcement.

14 SECTION 5. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
15 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
16 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
17 sum of Two Million Thirty-four Thousand Dollars (\$2,034,000.00)  
18 shall be used to expand connectivity programs between law  
19 enforcement officers, mental health providers and Oklahomans in a  
20 mental health crisis.

21 SECTION 6. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
22 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
23 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
24 sum of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00)

1 shall be used to expand the number of mental health crisis centers  
2 and urgent care centers.

3 SECTION 7. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
4 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
5 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
6 sum of Two Million Nine Hundred Sixty-six Thousand Dollars  
7 (\$2,966,000.00) shall be used for additional mobile crisis teams to  
8 respond and diffuse crisis situations in communities.

9 SECTION 8. From the funds appropriated to the Department of  
10 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill  
11 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the  
12 sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be used to  
13 maintain five pilot programs to provide offenders incarcerated in  
14 county jails in the State of Oklahoma access to United States Food  
15 and Drug Administration-approved, evidence-based, medication-  
16 assisted treatment for opioid and alcohol dependence. Treatment may  
17 be administered while the inmate is confined in the county jail and  
18 when participating in outpatient care upon release. Funding may  
19 only be used for medical evaluations, the purchase of United States  
20 Food and Drug Administration-approved medication to treat opioid or  
21 alcohol dependency, individual and group counseling services,  
22 cognitive behavioral therapies and necessary medical and behavioral  
23 health staff needed to implement the program.

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1 SECTION 9. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health  
2 and Substance Abuse Services may request through the Director of the  
3 Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by  
4 the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General  
5 Revenue Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Department's  
6 disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

7 SECTION 10. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 2900  
8 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, not including  
9 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for  
10 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (hereafter FY-22) or may be  
11 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 (hereafter FY-23).  
12 Funds budgeted for FY-22 may be encumbered only through June 30,  
13 2022, and must be expended by November 15, 2022. Any funds  
14 remaining after November 15, 2022, and not budgeted for FY-23, shall  
15 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal  
16 year. Funds budgeted for FY-23 may be encumbered only through June  
17 30, 2023. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2023, shall lapse  
18 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.  
19 These appropriations shall not be budgeted in both fiscal years  
20 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-22, and not required to pay  
21 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-23, after  
22 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared  
23 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds

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1 from the FY-22 budget work program and after such revision has been  
2 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
