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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-556, as
14	amended by Section 55, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020,
15	Section 1-556), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1-556. A. The State Department of Health, giving
17	consideration to the recommendations of the Advancement of Wellness
18	Advisory Council created in Section 44 of this act Section 1-103a.1
19	of this title, shall be responsible for evaluating and reporting to
20	the Governor and the State Commissioner of Health regarding
21	contracting for statewide services or issues related to breast
22	cancer including, but not limited to:
23	1. Mammography and pap smear screening of women for breast and
24	cervical cancer as an early detection health care measure $_{m{ au}}$ provided

1 by facilities which are accredited by national organizations that 2 have formed coalitions to issue national cancer screening 3 guidelines;

4 2. Medical referral of screened persons with abnormal breast
5 findings and, to the extent practical, for additional services or
6 assistance for such persons;

3. Education and training programs for health care
professionals to improve methods for the detection and control of
breast and cervical cancer, and to improve communication with breast
and cervical cancer patients after diagnosis;

Annual public education and awareness campaigns to improve
 the knowledge and health care practices of all Oklahomans with
 respect to breast and cervical cancer;

5. Epidemiological trend studies utilizing the data from the
Oklahoma Central Cancer Registry for incidence, prevalence and
survival of breast and cervical cancer victims; and

17 6. Outreach to groups with high proportions of uninsured and18 underinsured women.

B. The evaluative efforts of the Advisory Committee with respect to contracts for services specified in subsection A of this section shall provide appropriate oversight and requirements that result in:

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1. Enhanced quality control standards within facilities which
 2 perform diagnostic cancer screening for breast and cervical cancer;
 3 and

Establishment of a fee schedule for breast and cervical
 cancer screening and diagnosis that complies with accepted
 Medicare/Medicaid rates and that incorporates a sliding fee payment
 system to encourage self-responsibility.

The State Department of Health, giving consideration to the 8 С. 9 recommendations of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council 10 created in Section 44 of this act Section 1-103a.1 of this title, 11 shall report annually to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of 12 Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the State Board Commissioner of Health by October 1 of each year every 13 fifth year, beginning on October 1, 2021, activities completed 14 pursuant to the Oklahoma Breast and Cervical Cancer Act during the 15 prior five (5) fiscal year, years including a report of the funding 16 for revolving funds expended on related activities. The report 17 shall may identify populations at highest risk for breast or 18 cervical cancer, priority strategies, and emerging technologies, 19 including newly introduced therapies and preventive vaccines that 20 are effective in preventing and controlling the risk of breast and 21 cervical cancer, and any recommendations for additional funding, if 22 necessary, to provide screenings and treatment for breast and 23 cervical cancer for uninsured and underinsured women. 24 The report

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1 shall may further recommend strategies or actions to reduce the 2 costs of breast and cervical cancer in the State of Oklahoma this 3 state.

The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council shall evaluate 4 D. 5 the prospective termination or continuation of its ongoing duties on October 1, 2008. Such evaluation shall be made based on the 6 successful implementation of breast and cervical cancer reduction 7 plans and/or achievement of significant reductions in breast and 8 9 cervical cancer morbidity and mortality in the State of Oklahoma 10 this state. SECTION 2.
