For purposes of the exemption authorized 17 pursuant to subsection (b) B of Section 6 of Article X of the 18 Oklahoma Constitution, "livestock employed in support of the family" 19 means all horses, cattle, mules, asses, sheep, swine, goats, poultry 20 and any other livestock. 21 B. For purposes of the exemption authorized pursuant to 22 subsection (b) B of Section 6 of Article X of the Oklahoma 23 Constitution, and for purposes of this section, livestock owned by a 24 general partnership, limited partnership, corporation, limited

1	liability company, estate, trust or other lawfully recognized entity
2	the primary purpose of which is to confer the economic benefits
3	derived from the ownership of the livestock on two or more members
4	of the same family and not any persons who are not members of the
5	same family, whether such members are related by consanguinity or
6	affinity, shall be deemed to be livestock employed in support of the
7	family. For purposes of this subsection, an adopted child shall be
8	treated as being related by consanguinity to the person or persons
9	who become the adoptive parent or parents of such child.
10	C. For purposes of the exempt treatment provided by subsection
11	B of this section, a surviving spouse having no other family members
