8 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Department of
9 Commerce; requiring that portions of certain funds be
10 utilized for certain purposes; providing budgeting
11 and expenditure limitations and procedures; providing
12 for lapse of funds under certain conditions; and
13 providing for noncodification.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
16 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

17 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
18 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
19 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
20 (\$300,000.00) shall, under the direction of the Executive Director
21 of Commerce, be allocated to the Automotive Accelerator Program
22 within the Department. Such funds shall be used to attract original
23 equipment manufacturing and parts supply companies.

24 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

1 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
2 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
3 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand
4 Dollars (\$350,000.00) shall, under the direction of the Executive
5 Director of Commerce, be allocated to the Rogers State University
6 TV's Distance Learning Classroom.

7 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
8 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

9 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
10 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
11 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of One Hundred Eighty-eight
12 Thousand One Hundred Eighty-seven Dollars (\$188,187.00) shall, under
13 the direction of the Executive Director of Commerce, be used for the
14 Community Expansion of Nutrition Assistance Program.

15 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
16 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

17 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
18 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
19 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars
20 (\$60,000.00) shall, under the direction of the Executive Director of
21 Commerce, be allocated to support substate planning districts.

22 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
23 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

1 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
2 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
3 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Five Hundred Three Thousand
4 Two Hundred Fifty-eight Dollars (\$503,258.00) shall, under the
5 direction of the Executive Director of Commerce, be allocated to the
6 Seminole State College's Rural Business and Resources Center.

7 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
8 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

9 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
10 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
11 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars
12 (\$100,000.00) shall, under the direction of the Executive Director
13 of Commerce, be allocated to the Department's Aerospace Commerce
14 Economic Services (ACES) Program. Such funds shall be used for
15 maintaining the program.

16 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
17 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

18 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
19 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
20 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Seven Hundred Twelve Thousand
21 Two Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars (\$712,279.00) shall, under the
22 direction of the Executive Director of Commerce, be allocated to the
23 Oklahoma Film and Music Office within the Department. Such funds
24

1 shall be used for operational maintenance of the Office given its
2 transfer to the Department during the previous fiscal year.

3 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
4 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

5 From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
6 Commerce in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1040 of the 2nd Session of the
7 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Four Hundred Thirty-seven
8 Thousand Nine Hundred Nineteen Dollars (\$437,919.00) shall, under
9 the direction of the Executive Director of Commerce, be allocated to
10 the Department's Community Development program for the purpose of
11 supporting community action agencies.

12 SECTION 9. Appropriations made by this act, not including
13 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
14 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 (hereafter FY-23) or may be
15 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 (hereafter FY-24).
16 Funds budgeted for FY-23 may be encumbered only through June 30,
17 2023, and must be expended by November 15, 2023. Any funds
18 remaining after November 15, 2023, and not budgeted for FY-24, shall
19 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal
20 year. Funds budgeted for FY-24 may be encumbered only through June
21 30, 2024. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2024, shall lapse
22 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
23 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years
24 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-23, and not required to pay

1 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-24, after
2 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
3 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
4 from the FY-23 budget work program and after such revision has been
5 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
