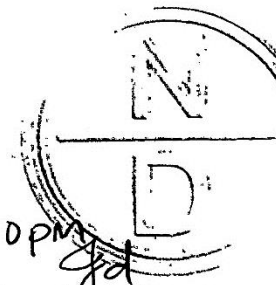

9 FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

10 An Act relating to health services for minors;  
11 prohibiting certain medical treatment for minors;  
12 providing penalty; defining term; providing for  
13 codification; and providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2607 of Title 63, unless there  
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. A person under the age of eighteen (18) years is prohibited  
19 from undergoing gender reassignment medical treatment in this state.

20 B. A health care professional who intentionally performs gender  
21 reassignment medical treatment on a person who is under the age of  
22 eighteen (18) years is subject to professional discipline by the  
23 State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, the State Board of  
24 Osteopathic Examiners, or the applicable health care professional

1 licensing board, up to and including suspension or revocation of any  
2 license or certification required to practice.

3 C. "Gender reassignment medical treatment" means any health  
4 care to facilitate the transitioning of a patient's assigned gender  
5 identity on the patient's birth certificate, to the gender identity  
6 experienced and defined by the patient. The term shall include, but  
7 not be limited to:

8 1. Interventions to suppress the development of endogenous  
9 secondary sex characteristics;

10 2. Interventions to align the patient's appearance or physical  
11 body with the patient's gender identity; and

12 3. Interventions to alleviate symptoms of clinically  
13 significant distress resulting from gender dysphoria, as defined in  
14 the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 5th  
15 Edition.

16 The term does not include behavioral health care services, such  
17 as mental health counseling or medications to treat depression,  
18 anxiety or similar disorders; provided, the medication does not have  
19 long-term altering effects on the gender of a minor.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
