 seq. of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- b. an osteopathic physician licensed under Section 620 et

- c. a physician assistant licensed under Section 519.1 et

The Oklahoma Board of Nursing may issue 15 temporary licenses to nurses from other states upon proper 16 17 application stating the purpose of said such licenses; provided, no temporary license may be issued for more than ninety (90) days. 18 Temporary license licenses may be renewed at the discretion of the 19 Board but shall not extend over a period longer than one (1) year. 20 B.
