14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:	
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 22 O.S. 2021, Section 60.1, is	
16	amended to read as follows:	
17	Section 60.1. As used in the Protection from Domestic Abuse Act	
18	and in the Domestic Abuse Reporting Act, Sections 40.5 through 40.7	
19	of this title, and Section 150.12B of Title 74 of the Oklahoma	
20	Statutes:	
21	1. "Coercive control" means unreasonably engaging in any of the	
22	following conduct with a current or former spouse, persons who are	
23	or were in an intimate partner or dating relationship, or persons	
24	who are biological parents of the same child:	

1	<u>a.</u>	intentionally isolating the person from friends,
2		relatives, or other sources of support,
3	<u>b.</u>	depriving the person of basic necessities,
4	<u>C.</u>	controlling, regulating, or monitoring the person's
5		movements, communications, daily behavior, finances,
6		economic resources, or access to services, which
7		includes stalking or cyberstalking,
8	<u>d.</u>	compelling the person by force, threat, or
9		intimidation including but not limited to threats
10		based on actual or suspected immigration status, to
11		engage in conduct from which the person has a right to
12		abstain, or to abstain from conduct that the person
13		has a right to pursue,
14	<u>e.</u>	committing or threatening to commit cruelty to an
15		animal that intimidates the person,
16	<u>f.</u>	forced sex acts or threats of a sexual nature
17		including, but not limited to, threatened acts of
18		sexual conduct or threats to release sexual images, or
19	<u>g.</u>	making demands on the person that limits free will and

21	2. "Dati	ng relationship" means intimate association, primarily

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characterized by affectionate or sexual involvement. For purposes

of this act, a casual acquaintance or ordinary fraternization

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between persons in a business or social context shall not constitute a dating relationship;

2. 3. "Domestic abuse" means any act of physical harm or the threat of imminent physical harm which is committed by an adult, emancipated minor, or minor child thirteen (13) years of age or older against another adult, emancipated minor or minor child who is currently or was previously an intimate partner or family or household member. Domestic abuse shall include acts of coercive control as defined by this section;

3. 4. "Family or household members" means:

- a. parents, including grandparents, stepparents, adoptive parents and foster parents,
- b. children, including grandchildren, stepchildren, adopted children and foster children,
- c. persons otherwise related by blood or marriage living in the same household, and
- d. persons otherwise related by blood or marriage;
- $\frac{4.5.}{5.}$ "Foreign protective order" means any valid order of protection issued by a court of another state or a tribal court;
- 5. 6. "Harassment" means a knowing and willful course or pattern of conduct by a family or household member or an individual who is or has been involved in a dating relationship with the person, directed at a specific person which seriously alarms or annoys the person, and which serves no legitimate purpose. The

course of conduct must be such as would cause a reasonable person to suffer substantial emotional distress and must actually cause substantial distress to the person. "Harassment" Harassment shall include, but not be limited to, harassing or obscene telephone calls in violation of Section 1172 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes and fear of death or bodily injury;

6. 7. "Intimate partner" means:

- a. current or former spouses,
- b. persons who are or were in a dating relationship,
- c. persons who are the biological parents of the same child, regardless of their marital status or whether they have lived together at any time, and
- d. persons who currently or formerly lived together in an intimate way, primarily characterized by affectionate or sexual involvement. A sexual relationship may be an indicator that a person is an intimate partner, but is never a necessary condition;
- 7. 8. "Mutual protective order" means a final protective order or orders issued to both a plaintiff who has filed a petition for a protective order and a defendant included as the defendant in the plaintiff's petition restraining the parties from committing domestic violence, stalking, harassment or rape against each other. If both parties allege domestic abuse, violence, stalking,

harassment or rape against each other, the parties shall do so by separate petition pursuant to Section 60.4 of this title;

- 8. 9. "Rape" means rape and rape by instrumentation in violation of Sections 1111 and 1111.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 9- 10. "Stalking" means the willful, malicious, and repeated following or harassment of a person by an adult, emancipated minor, or minor thirteen (13) years of age or older, in a manner that would cause a reasonable person to feel frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, or molested and actually causes the person being followed or harassed to feel terrorized, frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed or molested. Stalking also means a course of conduct composed of a series of two or more separate acts over a period of time, however short, evidencing a continuity of purpose or unconsented contact with a person that is initiated or continued without the consent of the individual or in disregard of the expressed desire of the individual that the contact be avoided or discontinued. Unconsented contact or course of conduct includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. following or appearing within the sight of that individual,
 - approaching or confronting that individual in a public place or on private property,
