[**amusements and sports - state-tribal gaming -
providing exception - offering Gaming Compact
Supplement related to sports pools - declaring
certain conduct and participation lawful -
effective date]**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 262, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 262. A. If at least four Indian tribes enter into the
model tribal-state compact set forth in Section 281 of this title,
and such compacts are approved by the Secretary of the Interior and
notice of such approval is published in the Federal Register, the

1 Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission ("Commission") shall license
2 organization licensees which are licensed pursuant to Section 205.2
3 of this title to conduct authorized gaming as that term is defined
4 by this act pursuant to this act utilizing gaming machines or
5 devices authorized by this act subject to the limitations of
6 subsection C of this section. No fair association or organization
7 licensed pursuant to Section 208.2 of this title or a city, town or
8 municipality incorporated or otherwise, or an instrumentality
9 thereof, may conduct authorized gaming as that term is defined by
10 this act.

11 Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 941 through 988 of
12 Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the conducting of and
13 participation in gaming in accordance with the provisions of this
14 act or the model compact set forth in Section 281 of this title is
15 lawful and shall not be subject to any criminal penalties. Provided
16 further, a licensed manufacturer or distributor licensed pursuant to
17 this act may manufacture, exhibit or store as a lawful activity any
18 machines or devices which are capable of being used to conduct the
19 following types of gaming:

- 20 1. Gaming authorized by the State-Tribal Gaming Act; or
- 21 2. Other gaming which may be lawfully conducted by an Indian
22 tribe in this state.

23 B. Except for Christmas Day, authorized gaming may only be
24 conducted by an organization licensee on days when the licensee is

1 either conducting live racing or is accepting wagers on simulcast
2 races at the licensee's racing facilities. Authorized gaming may
3 only be conducted by organization licensees at enclosure locations
4 where live racing is conducted. Under no circumstances shall
5 authorized gaming be conducted by an organization licensee at any
6 facility outside the organization licensee's racing enclosure. No
7 person who would not be eligible to be a patron of a pari-mutuel
8 system of wagering pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of
9 Section 208.4 of this title shall be admitted into any area of a
10 facility when authorized games are played nor be permitted to
11 operate, or obtain a prize from, or in connection with, the
12 operation of any authorized game, directly or indirectly.

13 C. In order to encourage the growth, sustenance and development
14 of live horse racing in this state and of the state's agriculture
15 and horse industries, the Commission is hereby authorized to issue
16 licenses to conduct authorized gaming to no more than three
17 organization licensees operating racetrack locations at which horse
18 race meetings with pari-mutuel wagering, as authorized by the
19 Commission pursuant to the provisions of this title, occurred in
20 calendar year 2001, as follows:

21 1. An organization licensee operating a racetrack location at
22 which an organization licensee is licensed to conduct a race meeting
23 pursuant to the provisions of Section 205.2 of this title located in
24 a county with a population exceeding six hundred thousand (600,000)

1 persons, according to the most recent Federal Decennial Census,
2 shall be licensed to operate not more than six hundred fifty (650)
3 player terminals in any year. Beginning with the third year after
4 an organization licensee is licensed pursuant to this paragraph to
5 operate such player terminals, such licensee may be licensed to
6 operate an additional fifty (50) player terminals. Beginning with
7 the fifth year after an organization licensee is licensed pursuant
8 to this paragraph to operate such player terminals, such licensee
9 may be licensed to operate a further additional fifty (50) player
10 terminals; and

11 2. Two organization licensees operating racetrack locations at
12 which the organization licensees are licensed to conduct race
13 meetings pursuant to the provisions of Section 205.2 of this title
14 located in counties with populations not exceeding four hundred
15 thousand (400,000) persons, according to the most recent Federal
16 Decennial Census, may each be licensed to operate not more than two
17 hundred fifty (250) player terminals in any year.

18 Subject to the limitations on the number of player terminals
19 permitted to each organization licensee, an organization licensee
20 may utilize electronic amusement games as defined in this act,
21 electronic bonanza-style bingo games as defined in this act and
22 electronic instant bingo games as defined in this act, and any type
23 of gaming machine or device that is specifically allowed by law and
24 that an Indian tribe in this state is authorized to utilize pursuant

1 to a compact entered into between the state and the tribe in
2 accordance with the provisions of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act
3 and any other machine or device that an Indian tribe in this state
4 is lawfully permitted to operate pursuant to the Indian Gaming
5 Regulatory Act, referred to collectively as "authorized games". An
6 organization licensee's utilization of such machines or devices
7 shall be subject to the regulatory control and supervision of the
8 Commission; provided, the Commission shall have no role in oversight
9 and regulation of gaming conducted by a tribe subject to a compact.
10 The Commission shall promulgate rules to regulate the operation and
11 use of authorized gaming by organization licensees. In promulgating
12 such rules, the Commission shall consider the provisions of any
13 compact which authorizes electronic gaming which is specifically
14 authorized by law by an Indian tribe. For the purpose of paragraphs
15 1 and 2 of this subsection, the number of player terminals in an
16 authorized game that permits multiple players shall be determined by
17 the maximum number of players that can participate in that game at
18 any given time; provided, however, that nothing in this act
19 prohibits the linking of player terminals for progressive jackpots,
20 so long as the limitations on the number of permitted player
21 terminals at each organization licensee are not exceeded. Each
22 organization licensee shall keep a record of, and shall report at
23 least quarterly to the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission, the number
24 of games authorized by this section utilized in the organization

1 | licensee's facility, by the name or type of each and its identifying
2 | number.

3 | D. No zoning or other local ordinance may be adopted or amended
4 | by a political subdivision where an organization licensee conducts
5 | live horse racing with the intent to restrict or prohibit an
6 | organization licensee's right to conduct authorized gaming at such
7 | location.

8 | E. For purposes of this act, "adjusted gross revenues" means
9 | the total receipts received by an organization licensee from the
10 | play of all authorized gaming minus all monetary payouts.

11 | F. The Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission shall promulgate rules
12 | to regulate, implement and enforce the provisions of this act with
13 | regard to the conduct of authorized gaming by organization
14 | licensees; provided, regulation and oversight of games covered by a
15 | compact and operated by an Indian tribe shall be conducted solely
16 | pursuant to the requirements of the compact.

17 | G. If an organization licensee operates or attempts to operate
18 | more player terminals which offer authorized games than it is
19 | authorized to offer to the public by this act or the terms of its
20 | license, upon written notice from the Commission, such activity
21 | shall cease forthwith. Such activity shall constitute a basis upon
22 | which the Commission may suspend or revoke the licensee's license.
23 | The Commission shall promulgate any rules and regulations necessary
24 | to enforce the provisions of this subsection.

1 H. This act is game-specific and shall not be construed to
2 allow the operation of any other form of gaming unless specifically
3 allowed by this act. This act shall not permit the operation of
4 slot machines, house-banked card games, house-banked table games
5 involving dice or roulette wheels, or ~~games where winners are~~
6 ~~determined by~~ wagering on the outcome of a sports contest; provided,
7 however, that wagering on the outcome of sports contests may be
8 conducted in accordance with Section 3 of this act.

9 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 280, is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 Section 280. The State of Oklahoma through the concurrence of
12 the Governor after considering the executive prerogatives of that
13 office and the power to negotiate the terms of a compact between the
14 state and a tribe, and by means of the execution of the State-Tribal
15 Gaming Act, and with the concurrence of the State Legislature
16 through the enactment of the State-Tribal Gaming Act, hereby makes
17 the following offer of a ~~model tribal gaming compact~~ Model Tribal
18 Gaming Compact regarding gaming to all federally recognized Indian
19 tribes as identified in the Federal Register within this state that
20 own or are the beneficial owners of Indian lands as defined by the
21 Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C., Section 2703(4), and over
22 which the tribe has jurisdiction as recognized by the Secretary of
23 the Interior and is a part of the tribe's "Indian reservation" as
24 defined in 25 C.F.R., Part 151.2 or has been acquired pursuant to 25

1 C.F.R., Part 151, which, if accepted, shall constitute a gaming
2 compact between this state and the accepting tribe for purposes of
3 the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act. Acceptance of the offer contained
4 in this section shall be through the signature of the chief
5 executive officer of the tribal government whose authority to enter
6 into the ~~compact~~ Compact shall be set forth in an accompanying law
7 or ordinance or resolution by the governing body of the tribe, a
8 copy of which shall be provided by the tribe to the Governor. No
9 further action by the Governor or the state is required before the
10 ~~compact~~ Compact can take effect. A tribe accepting this Model
11 Tribal Gaming Compact is responsible for submitting a copy of the
12 Compact executed by the tribe to the Secretary of the Interior for
13 approval and publication in the Federal Register. The tribe shall
14 provide a copy of the executed Compact to the Governor. No tribe
15 shall be required to agree to terms different than the terms set
16 forth in the Model Tribal Gaming Compact, which is set forth in
17 Section 281 of this title. As a precondition to execution of the
18 Model Tribal Gaming Compact by any tribe, the tribe must have paid
19 or entered into a written agreement for payment of any fines
20 assessed prior to the effective date of the State-Tribal Gaming Act
21 by the federal government with respect to the tribe's gaming
22 activities pursuant to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act.

23 Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 941 through 988 of
24 Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the conducting of and the

1 participation in any game authorized by the ~~model-compact~~ Model
2 Tribal Gaming Compact set forth in Section 281 of this title are
3 lawful when played pursuant to a compact which has become effective.

4 1. Prior to July 1, 2008, of all fees received by the state
5 pursuant to subsection A of Part 11 of the Model Tribal Gaming
6 Compact set forth in Section 281 of this title:

- 7 a. twelve percent (12%) shall be deposited in the
- 8 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund, and
- 9 b. eighty-eight percent (88%) of such fees shall be
- 10 deposited in the Education Reform Revolving Fund.

11 2. On or after July 1, 2008, of all fees received by the state
12 pursuant to subsection A of Part 11 of the Model Tribal Gaming
13 Compact set forth in Section 281 of this title and Gaming Compact
14 Supplements offered pursuant to Section ~~2~~ 280.1 of this title and
15 Section 3 of this act:

- 16 a. twelve percent (12%) shall be deposited in the General
- 17 Revenue Fund, and
- 18 b. eighty-eight percent (88%) of such fees shall be
- 19 deposited in the Education Reform Revolving Fund.

20 Provided, the first Twenty Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-three
21 Dollars and thirty-three cents (\$20,833.33) of all fees received
22 each month by the state pursuant to subsection A of Part 11 of the
23 Model Tribal Gaming Compact set forth in Section 281 of this title
24 and Gaming Compact Supplements offered pursuant to Section ~~2~~ 280.1

1 of this title and Section 3 of this act shall be transferred to the
2 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services for the
3 treatment of compulsive gambling disorder and educational programs
4 related to such disorder.

5 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 280.2 of Title 3A, unless there
7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 A. Provided that federal laws permit and pursuant to the offer
9 of the Model Tribal Gaming Compact made in Section 280 of Title 3A
10 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the definition of "covered games" in
11 the Model Tribal Gaming Compact codified in Section 281 of Title 3A
12 of the Oklahoma Statutes, which said codified compact offer provides
13 the state may approve additional forms of covered games under said
14 compact by amendment of the State-Tribal Gaming Act and a compacting
15 tribe may operate such additional forms of covered games by written
16 supplement to an existing compact, the state hereby approves,
17 subject to this section, an additional game offering as follows:

18 "Sports pools" means any wagering on the outcome of sporting
19 events or other events, other than horse or other animal races.

20 B. Should a tribe that has compacted with the state in
21 accordance with Sections 280 and 281 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma
22 Statutes elect to accept this offer of an additional covered game
23 and, accordingly, to operate sports pools under the terms of its
24

1 existing gaming compact with the state, said tribe shall execute a
2 supplement to said compact, to provide as follows:

3 MODEL TRIBAL GAMING COMPACT SUPPLEMENT

4 Between the [Name of Tribe]

5 and the STATE OF OKLAHOMA

6 To be governed in accord with the [Name of Tribe]'s State-Tribal
7 Gaming Compact ("Compact"), approved by the United States Department
8 of the Interior on [Date], the [Name of Tribe] ("Tribe") accepts the
9 state's offer of additional covered game codified in Section 280.2
10 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes, which offer and this
11 acceptance are subject to the following terms:

12 Part 1. TITLE

13 This document shall be referred to as the "[Name of Tribe] and
14 State of Oklahoma Gaming Compact Sports Pools Supplement (Gaming
15 Compact Supplement)".

16 Part 2. TERMS

17 A. The Tribe hereby memorializes its election to accept the
18 state's offer of an additional covered game, which offer is codified
19 in Section 280.2 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Tribe
20 further certifies and agrees it shall not offer such additional
21 covered game unless and until doing so would be legal under federal
22 law.

23 B. The Tribe agrees, subject to the enforcement and exclusivity
24 provisions of its Compact, to pay to the State ten percent (10%) of

1 the monthly net win from the operation of sports pools. "Net win"
2 shall mean all money wagered less prizes paid out and less
3 applicable federal taxes. The Tribe is entitled to keep an amount
4 equal to State payments from the operation of sports pools. For all
5 purposes, such payment shall be deemed an exclusivity and fee
6 payment under paragraph 2 of subsection A of Part 11 of the State-
7 Tribal Gaming Compact between the electing Tribe and the State.

8 C. The Tribe's operation of sports pools pursuant to this
9 Gaming Compact Supplement shall, for all purposes, including
10 enforcement and exclusivity, be treated as subject to and lawfully
11 conducted under the terms and provisions of the Compact.

12 Part 3. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE

13 This Gaming Compact Supplement, to the extent it conforms with
14 Section 280.2 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes, is deemed
15 approved by the State of Oklahoma. No further action of the State
16 or any state official is necessary for this Gaming Compact
17 Supplement to take effect upon approval by the Secretary of the
18 United States Department of the Interior and publication in the
19 Federal Register. The undersigned tribal official(s) represents
20 that he or she is duly authorized and has the authority to execute
21 this Gaming Compact Supplement on behalf of the Tribe for whom he or
22 she is signing.

3 C. A tribe electing to accept this additional game offering is
4 responsible for submitting a copy of the executed supplement to the
5 Secretary of the United States Department of the Interior for
6 approval and publication in the Federal Register.

7 D. Upon approval of a supplement by the Secretary of the United
8 States Department of the Interior, said supplement shall be
9 construed as an acceptance of this offer and a supplement to the
10 Tribe's existing State-Tribal Gaming Compact with the State.
11 Thereafter, sports pools shall be deemed a covered game pursuant to
12 said Compact.

13 E. Upon approval of a supplement by the Secretary of the United
14 States Department of the Interior and subject to the enforcement and
15 exclusivity provisions of its existing State-Tribal Gaming Compact
16 with the state, the electing tribe shall be deemed pursuant to such
17 supplement to be in agreement to pay ten percent (10%) of the
18 monthly net win from the operation of sports pools. The Tribe is
19 entitled to keep an amount equal to state payments from the
20 operation of sports pools. For all purposes, such payment shall be
21 deemed an exclusivity and fee payment under paragraph 2 of
22 subsection A of Part 11 of the State-Tribal Gaming Compact between
23 the electing Tribe and the State.

1 F. The offer contained in this section shall not be construed
2 to permit the operation of any additional form of gaming by
3 organization licensees or permit any additional electronic or
4 machine gaming within Oklahoma.

5 G. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 941 through 988
6 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the conducting of and
7 participation in any game authorized pursuant to this section are
8 lawful when played pursuant to a compact supplement which has become
9 effective in accordance with this section.

10 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
