

1 A. On November 8, 2022, the standard time in Oklahoma shall be
2 known as Central Standard Time.

3 B. This section shall not be construed to affect the standard
4 time established by United States law governing the movements of
5 common carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for
6 performance of an act by an officer or department of the United
7 States, as established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or
8 regulation of the United States or an agency hereof.

9 C. As authorized by the Uniform Time Act of 1966, as amended,
10 and notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary by
11 the United States government relating to adoption of daylight saving
12 time by all of the states, the State of Oklahoma elects to reject
13 such time and elects to continue in force the terms of subsection A
14 of this section relating to standard time in Oklahoma.

15 D. The rejection of daylight saving time as provided for in
16 this section may be changed by future legislative action.

17 SECTION 3. The Ballot Title for the proposed act shall be in
18 the following form:

21 THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

22 The measure establishes that standard time in Oklahoma shall be
23 known as Central Standard Time. The measure rejects the
24 adoption of daylight saving time in this state and mandates the

1 state operate on standard time. The measure allows future
2 legislative action regarding the rejection of daylight saving
3 time. Central Standard Time in Oklahoma shall begin on November
4 8, 2022.
