NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5171 of Title 74, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 20 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Α. Consumer Energy Choice Act". 21 B. For the purposes of this act, "energy source" means any fuel 22 or power source used to power an engine including but not limited to 23 any of the following: aviation fuel, biofuel, compressed natural 24

2	vehicles, gasoline, gas distillates, hydrogen, liquified petroleum
3	gas, and renewable diesel.
4	C. No city, town, county, or subdivision thereof shall adopt an
5	ordinance, rule, or code which limits consumer access to an energy
6	source or that results in the de facto prohibition of a wholesaler,
7	retailer, energy producer, or the related infrastructure that is
8	necessary to provide consumer access to a specific energy source
9	within the jurisdiction of a city, town, county, or subdivision
10	thereof.
11	D. For the purposes of promoting commerce and the equitable
12	treatment of the citizens of this state, limitations of consumer
13	access to an energy source by any city, town, county, or subdivision
14	thereof is declared to be a statewide concern and shall be

equitable consumer r subdivision thereof is declared to be a statewide concern and shall be prohibited pursuant to subsection C of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
