12 of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services -
13 state agencies are charged no more than actual cost]**

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 34.6, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 34.6 A. The Director of the Office of Management and
18 Enterprise Services shall have the power and duty under the
19 direction of the Governor to:

20 1. Prepare the budget document and assist in the drafting of
21 legislation to make it effective;

22 2. Make field surveys and studies of governmental agencies,
23 looking toward economy and greater efficiency;

24 3. Make allotments to control expenditures;

4. Authorize transfers of appropriation authorized by law;

5. Study accounting and other reports rendered by the Central
Accounting and Reporting Division;

1 1. Health insurance premiums set by the Employees Group
2 Insurance Division;
3 2. Insurance premiums set by the Risk Management Division;
4 3. Rates, fees, or other collections by the Central Purchasing
5 Division for duties prescribed to the Division by law;
6 4. Rates, fees, or other collections by the state or federal
7 surplus programs for duties prescribed to the programs by law; or
8 5. Rates resulting in notification to the Office of Management
9 and Enterprise Services or agency receiving the services from a
10 federal authority of alleged noncompliance with federal law or
11 federal agency rule that specifically cites the rate at issue and
12 provides a clear rationale explaining the alleged noncompliance, and
13 only if the Director of the Office and Management and Enterprise
14 Services determines the allegation is accurate and likely to result
15 in a loss of current or future federal funding.

16 E. The Governmental Technology Applications Revenue Board
17 shall settle any dispute if a state agency objects to the rates
18 proposed by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services if the
19 state agency alleges a rate to be noncompliant with subsection D of
20 this section. The Board shall use the description of actual cost in
21 subsection D of this section along with other cost accounting
22 principles it deems appropriate to determine the appropriateness of
23 the proposed rate. If the proposed rate is determined to be in
24 excess of actual cost, the Board shall recommend an appropriate rate

1 range. The Board shall only be required to settle disputes
2 concerning rates prior to billing and shall not be required to
3 settle disputes concerning billing or other matters after services
4 are provided or to settle disputes concerning the same rates in
5 consecutive fiscal years if a prior recommendation was made
6 concerning those rates.

7 F. For purposes of this section, "state agency" includes any
8 office, officer, bureau, board, council, court, commission,
9 institution, unit, division, body, or house of the legislative,
10 executive, or judicial branches of the state government, whether
11 elected or appointed, excluding only political subdivisions of the
12 state.
