AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-145.3, is amended to read as follows: 14 Section 3-145.3 A. Subject to the requirements of the Oklahoma 15 Charter Schools Act, the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board 16 shall: 17 Provide oversight of the operations of statewide virtual 18 1. charter schools in this state; 19 2. Establish a procedure for accepting, approving and 20 disapproving statewide virtual charter school applications and a 21 process for renewal or revocation of approved charter school 22 contracts which minimally meet the procedures set forth in the 23 24 Oklahoma Charter Schools Act;

1 3. Make publicly available a list of supplemental online courses which have been reviewed and certified by the Statewide 2 Virtual Charter School Board to ensure that the courses are high 3 quality options and are aligned with the subject matter standards 4 5 adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 11-103.6 of this title. The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall 6 give special emphasis on listing supplemental online courses in 7 science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), foreign language 8 9 and advanced placement courses. School districts shall not be limited to selecting supplemental online courses that have been 10 reviewed and certified by the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board 11 12 and listed as provided for in this paragraph; and

4. In conjunction with the Office of Management and Enterprise
Services, negotiate and enter into contracts with supplemental
online course providers to offer a state rate price to school
districts for supplemental online courses that have been reviewed
and certified by the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board and
listed as provided for in paragraph 3 of this subsection.

B. Except as otherwise provided by law, each statewide virtual
<u>charter school which has been approved and sponsored by the Board</u>
<u>shall be subject to and comply with the requirements of the Oklahoma</u>
<u>Charter Schools Act.</u> Each statewide virtual charter school which
has been approved and sponsored by the Board or any virtual charter
school for which the Board has assumed sponsorship of as provided

for in Section 3-145.5 of this title shall be considered a statewide virtual charter school and, except as provided in subsection H of this section, the geographic boundaries of each statewide virtual charter school shall be the borders of the state.

5 C. Each statewide virtual charter school approved by the 6 Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall be eligible to receive 7 federal funds generated by students enrolled in the charter school 8 for the applicable year. Each statewide virtual charter school 9 shall be considered a separate local education agency for purposes 10 of reporting and accountability.

D. As calculated as provided for in Section 3-142 of this 11 12 title, a statewide virtual charter school shall receive the State Aid allocation and any other state-appropriated revenue generated by 13 students enrolled in the virtual charter school for the applicable 14 year, less up to five percent (5%) three percent (3%) of the State 15 Aid allocation, which may be retained by the Statewide Virtual 16 17 Charter School Board for administrative expenses and to support the mission of the Board. A statewide virtual charter school shall be 18 eligible for any other funding any other charter school is eligible 19 for as provided for in Section 3-142 of this title. Each statewide 20 virtual charter school shall be considered a separate local 21 education agency for purposes of reporting and accountability. 22 E. A virtual charter school shall be subject to the same 23 reporting requirements, financial audits, audit procedures, and 24

audit requirements as a school district <u>and compliance requirements</u>
<u>provided in Section 3-136 of this title</u>. The State Department of
Education or State Auditor and Inspector may conduct financial,
program or compliance audits. A virtual charter school shall use
the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System (OCAS) to report financial
transactions to the State Department of Education.

F. A virtual charter school governing body board shall be 7 responsible for the policies that govern the operational decisions 8 9 of the virtual charter school. The governing body board of a virtual charter school shall be subject to the same conflict of 10 interest requirements as a member of a local school board including, 11 but not limited to, Sections 5-113 and 5-124 of this title. Members 12 appointed to the governing body board of a virtual charter school 13 after July 1, 2019, shall be subject to the same instruction and 14 continuing education requirements as a member of a local school 15 board and pursuant to Section 5-110 of this title, complete twelve 16 (12) hours of instruction within fifteen (15) months of appointment 17 to the governing body board, and pursuant to Section 5-110.1 of this 18 title, attend continuing education. Members appointed to the 19 governing board of a virtual charter school prior to July 1, 2019, 20 shall comply with the requirements of this subsection and, within 21 fifteen (15) months of the effective date of this act, shall 22 complete twelve (12) hours of instruction pursuant to Section 5-110 23 24 of this title.

G. Students enrolled full-time in a statewide virtual charter school sponsored by the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall not be authorized to participate in any activities administered by the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association. However, the students may participate in intramural activities sponsored by a statewide virtual charter school, an online provider for the charter school or any other outside organization.

H. 1. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, a public 8 9 school student who wishes to enroll in a virtual charter school shall be considered a transfer student from their resident school 10 district. A virtual charter school shall pre-enroll any public 11 12 school student whose parent expresses intent to enroll in the district virtual charter school. Upon pre-enrollment, the State 13 Department of Education shall initiate a transfer on a form to be 14 completed by the receiving virtual charter school. Upon approval of 15 the receiving virtual charter school, the student may begin 16 instructional activities. Upon notice that a public school student 17 has transferred to a virtual charter school, the resident school 18 district shall transmit the student's records within three (3) 19 school days. 20

2. The State Department of Education shall notify the
 Legislature and Governor if it determines that the information
 technology infrastructure necessary to process the transfer of

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students to a virtual charter school is inadequate and one (1)
 additional school year is needed for implementation.

A public school student may transfer to one statewide 3 3. virtual charter school at any time during a school year. For 4 5 purposes of this subsection, "school year" shall mean July 1 through the following June 30. After one statewide virtual charter school 6 transfer during a school year, no public school student shall be 7 permitted to transfer to any other statewide virtual charter school 8 9 without the concurrence of both the resident school district and the receiving virtual charter school. A student shall have a grace 10 period of fifteen (15) school days from the first day of enrollment 11 in a statewide virtual charter school to withdraw without academic 12 penalty and shall continue to have the option of one virtual charter 13 school transfer without the concurrence of both districts during 14 that same school year. A statewide virtual charter school student 15 that has utilized the allowable one transfer pursuant to this 16 subsection shall not be permitted to transfer to another district or 17 other statewide virtual charter school without first notifying his 18 or her resident district and initiating a new transfer. Upon 19 cancellation of a transfer the virtual charter school shall transmit 20 the student's records to the student's new school district within 21 three (3) school days. Students enrolled in a statewide virtual 22 charter school shall not be required to submit a virtual charter 23 transfer for consecutive years of enrollment. Any student enrolled 24

1 in a statewide virtual charter school the year prior to the 2 implementation of this section shall not be required to submit a 3 transfer in order to remain enrolled.

4 4. For purposes of this subsection, "parent" shall mean the
5 parent of the student or person having custody of the student as
6 provided for in paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 1-113 of this
7 title.

8 I. 1. A student shall be eligible to enroll in a statewide 9 virtual charter school if he or she is a student whose parent or 10 legal guardian is transferred or is pending transfer to a military 11 installation within this state while on active military duty 12 pursuant to an official military order.

A statewide virtual charter school shall accept applications
 by electronic means for enrollment and course registration for
 students described in paragraph 1 of this subsection.

3. The parent or legal guardian of a student described in paragraph 1 of this subsection shall provide proof of residence in this state within ten (10) days after the published arrival date provided on official documentation. A parent or legal guardian may use the following addresses as proof of residence:

a. a temporary on-base billeting facility,
b. a purchased or leased home or apartment, or
c. federal government or public-private venture off-base
military housing.

- 4. The provisions of paragraph 3 of subsection H shall apply to
 students described in paragraph 1 of this subsection.
 - 5. For purposes of this subsection:

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- 4a."active military duty" means full-time military duty5status in the active uniformed service of the United6States including members of the National Guard and7Military Reserve on active duty orders, and
- b. "military installation" means a base, camp, post,
 station, yard, center, homeport facility for any ship
 or other installation under the jurisdiction of the
 Department of Defense or the United States Coast
 Guard.
- J. A virtual charter school shall not accept or deny a transfer based on ethnicity, national origin, gender, income level, disabling condition, proficiency in the English language, measure of achievement, aptitude or athletic ability.

The decision of the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board Κ. 17 to deny, nonrenew or terminate the charter contract of a statewide 18 virtual charter school may be appealed to the State Board of 19 Education within thirty (30) days of the decision by the Statewide 20 Virtual Charter School Board. The State Board of Education shall 21 act on the appeal within sixty (60) days of receipt of the request 22 from the statewide virtual charter school applicant. The State 23 Board of Education may reverse the decision of the Statewide Virtual 24

1 Charter School Board or may remand the matter back to the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board for further proceeding as directed. 2 SECTION 2. Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, any governing 6 board of a charter school which contracts with an educational 7 management organization or charter management organization as 8 9 defined in Section 5-200 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall: 1. Consist of a minimum of five (5) members, including one 10 member who shall be a parent, grandparent, legal guardian, or 11 learning coach of a student who attends the charter school. As used 12 in this paragraph, "learning coach" means a designated person who 13 has the primary responsibility of being actively involved in all 14 school-related work and activities of a student. The bylaws of the 15 charter school shall set specific terms of service for charter 16 school governing board members; 17

18 2. Meet at least one (1) time per month;

Adopt a charter which shall ensure compliance with the same
 requirements and guidelines as provided in Section 3-136 of Title 70
 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

4. Appoint an encumbrance clerk as provided in Section 5-119 of
Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and a treasurer as provided in
Section 5-114 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon

appointment, the encumbrance clerk and treasurer shall attend and complete at least eight (8) hours of instruction offered by an auditor approved by the State Auditor and Inspector. Each year, the encumbrance clerk and treasurer shall complete at least three (3) hours of continuing education offered by an auditor approved by the State Auditor and Inspector; and

5. Submit to the State Department of Education copies of any
contract executed between the charter school governing board or
charter school sponsor governing board and an educational management
organization or charter management organization. The Department and
the sponsor shall publish the contracts on their websites.

B. Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, members of a charter school governing board which contracts with an educational management organization or charter management organization shall:

Not receive pecuniary gain, incidentally or otherwise, from
 the earnings of the educational management organization, charter
 management organization, or school; and

Not be appointed or selected by any person affiliated with
 the educational management organization or charter management
 organization.

21 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-145.10 of Title 70, unless 23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1 A. 1. State funds appropriated to any charter school which 2 contracts with an educational management organization or charter management organization as defined in Section 5-200 of Title 70 of 3 the Oklahoma Statutes, including the State Aid allocation and any 4 5 other state-appropriated revenue pursuant to Section 3-142 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, shall remain public funds maintained in 6 public accounts subject to audit, transparency, oversight, and 7 financial reporting and shall not be transferred or converted in any 8 9 way to private funds except for funds which are paid for charter 10 school expenses and funds which are paid to the educational management organization or charter management organization from the 11 12 charter school pursuant to the terms of the contract and in accordance with state law and Internal Revenue Service requirements. 13 If there is any question or potential discrepancy regarding use of 14 funds paid to the educational management organization or charter 15 management organization by the State Department of Education, 16 charter school governing board or charter school sponsor, the 17 educational management organization or charter management 18 organization shall provide invoices and financial documentation to 19 the requesting entity proving the educational management 20 organization or charter management organization is following the 21 terms of the contract and is in compliance with the law. 22 2. Any state funds which are designated as student funds are 23

extracurricular and educational activity funds, and shall remain public funds maintained in public accounts subject to audit, transparency, oversight and financial reporting and expended in accordance with purchasing requirements provided in Section 5-135 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Students shall receive a grade for participation in extracurricular or educational activities as described in this subsection.

3. Any property purchased with public funds pursuant to this
9 section may be assigned to employees or students of the charter
10 school for charter school employment, extracurricular, or
11 educational purposes, but shall remain public property of the
12 charter school.

в. In the third year of the charter school contract term, an 13 auditor selected from a list of auditors approved and maintained by 14 the State Auditor and Inspector shall conduct an operating agreement 15 review of each charter school which contracts with an educational 16 management organization or charter management organization to verify 17 the charter school and the educational management organization or 18 charter management organization are following the terms of the 19 contract and complying with state law, federal law, and Internal 20 Revenue Service requirements. The auditor may request additional 21 documentation from the charter school, educational management 22 organization, or charter management organization to address any 23 question or potential discrepancy. The charter school sponsor shall 24

C. Every provider or entity that contracts with a charter
school for expenditure of state funds pursuant to paragraph 2 of
subsection A of this section shall:

7 1. Have an agreement in writing with the charter school which 8 clearly states the goods or services being provided by the provider 9 or entity pursuant to the contract and the costs thereof and that 10 such goods, services, and employees of the provider or entity comply 11 with federal and state laws; and

12 2. Have on file with the State Department of Education a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma 13 State Bureau of Investigation or equivalent criminal history record 14 check from another state as well as a national criminal history 15 record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 16 Statutes for every owner and employee of the provider or entity who 17 will have contact with students pursuant to the contract. 18 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check or equivalent 19 criminal history record check from another state, the provider or 20 entity may begin extracurricular or educational activities until 21 receipt of the national criminal history record check. The provider 22 or entity shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history 23 record checks. Results of the checks shall be included as a 24

3 D. An educational management organization or charter management 4 organization shall not:

23 Section 5-200. A. As used in this section, "educational title:

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1 1. "Educational management organization" means a for-profit or nonprofit organization that receives public funds to provide 2 administration and management services for a charter school, 3 statewide virtual charter school, or traditional public school; and 4 5 2. "Charter management organization" means a nonprofit organization that receives public funds to provide administration 6 and management services for a charter school, statewide virtual 7 charter school, or traditional public school. 8 9 в. A charter school that contracts with an educational management organization or charter management organization shall use 10 the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System (OCAS) to report the total 11 amount paid to an educational management organization or charter 12 management organization pursuant to the terms of the contract as 13 well as actual itemized expenditure information for the goods or 14 services provided by the management organization as defined by OCAS 15 expenditure codes, including the total compensation package of the 16 superintendent including the base salary, insurance, retirement and 17 other fringe benefits. 18

C. Any <u>Pursuant to Internal Revenue Service guidelines, any</u>
 owner of an educational management organization <u>or charter</u>
 <u>management organization</u> shall be required to disclose to the
 governing board of the school in a public meeting any ownership
 position in any business that contracts or proposes to contract with

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the same public school that the educational management organization
 or charter management organization is managing.

D. <u>An educational management organization or a charter</u>
<u>management organization which contracts with more than one school</u>
district shall not commingle funds of the school districts.

6 Whenever any person shall enter into a contract with any Ε. school district or public charter school in the state to teach in 7 such school district or public charter school the contract shall be 8 9 binding on the teacher and on the board of education until the 10 teacher legally has been discharged from the teaching position or released by the board of education from the contract. Except as 11 12 provided in Section 5-106A of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, until such teacher has been thus discharged or released, the 13 teacher shall not have authority to enter into a contract with any 14 other board of education in Oklahoma for the same time covered by 15 the original contract. If upon written complaint by the board of 16 education in a district any teacher is reported to have failed to 17 obey the terms of the contract previously made and to have entered 18 into a contract with another board of education, including a public 19 charter school board of education, without having been released from 20 the former contract except as provided in Section 5-106A of Title 70 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, the teacher, upon being found 22 to be employed full-time for another public school, including a 23 public charter school in the state, at a hearing held before the 24

State Board of Education, shall have such teacher's certificate
 suspended for the remainder of the term for which the contract was
 made.

4 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 18-118, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 18-118. A. The State Auditor and Inspector shall 7 approve auditors who shall audit the funds of the public school 8 districts and the use made of the monies thereof, and shall make 9 such other audits as may be required by the State Auditor and 10 Inspector.

B. School districts and officers and employees thereof who divert any monies received by a district from the purpose for which the monies were apportioned to the district shall be jointly and severally liable for any such diversion.

C. If audits disclose that state monies have been illegally 15 apportioned to, or illegally disbursed or expended by, a school 16 district or any of its officers or employees or an educational 17 management organization or charter management organization as 18 defined in Section 5-200 of this title or any of its owners or 19 employees, the State Board of Education shall make demand that the 20 monies be returned to the State Treasurer by such the school 21 district or educational management organization or charter 22 management organization. If the monies are illegally apportioned to 23 24 or disbursed or expended by a school district or any of its officers
