	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
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17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.60 of Title 70, unless

SENATE FLOOR VERSION - SB1671 SFLR (Bold face denotes Committee Amendments) B. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, Holocaust education shall be taught to students in grades six through twelve in public schools in this state. Holocaust education may be integrated into one or more existing courses of study and shall be taught in a manner that:

6 1. Generates an understanding of the causes, course, and7 effects of the Holocaust;

8 2. Develops dialogue with students on the ramifications of9 bullying, bigotry, stereotyping, and discrimination; and

Encourages tolerance of diversity and reverence for human
dignity for all citizens in a pluralistic society.

C. The State Department of Education, in consultation with an organization whose mission is to preserve and enhance Jewish life and wellbeing in this state, shall develop and implement high quality professional learning opportunities for Holocaust education teachers.

D. As used in this section, "Holocaust" means the systematic, state-sponsored persecution and attempted annihilation of Jews and other groups by the Nazi regime in Germany between 1933 and 1945, which resulted in the murder of approximately six million Jews and five million other individuals.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
