11	providing prospective rulemaking authority to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce; authorizing the
12	Oklahoma Department of Commerce to promulgate certain rules; amending 68 O.S. 2011, Sections 3623, as
13	amended by Section 2, Chapter 313, O.S.L. 2019 and 3624, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 313,
14	O.S.L. 2019 (68 O.S. Supp. 2020, Sections 3623 and 3624), which relate to the Compete with Canada Film
15	Act; clarifying statutory language; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 500.18, as last amended by Section 10, Chapter 260, 0.5 L, 2016 (74.0 S, Supp. 2020, Section
16 17	Chapter 269, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 500.18), which relates to the State Travel Reimbursement Act; authorizing the Oklahoma
18	Department of Commerce to reimburse certain expenditures of the Oklahoma Film and Music Office;
19	requiring the director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to coordinate the transfer of
20	the Oklahoma Film and Music Office to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce; providing for
21	noncodification; and providing an effective date.
22	
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 2236, as
 amended by Section 33, Chapter 227, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2020,
 Section 2236), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2236. A. There is hereby created within the Department 4 5 Oklahoma Department of Commerce, the Oklahoma Film and Music Office. The Office shall have the primary responsibility in state government 6 7 for promoting the state as a location for producing motion pictures, television programs, videos and recording or performing music. 8 The 9 Office shall assist the motion picture, television and video film 10 and music industries by providing production contacts in the state, 11 suggesting possible filming, performing, publishing, and recording 12 locations, and other activities that may be required to promote the state as a filming and music center. The Office shall develop 13 resource guides, a database, and a web site. The Office shall 14 15 develop listings of music festivals and music events being held in Oklahoma. 16

B. The Oklahoma Film and Music Office shall cooperate with other state and local offices as required to promote the film and music industries in this state.

C. The Oklahoma Film and Music Office shall establish a film production registration program. Under the program, film production companies shall be required to register with the Office prior to starting production on a film located in the state. The Office shall not require production companies to pay a fee for

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registration. The purpose of the program shall be to allow the
 Office to accurately track the number of filming productions
 occurring in the state and the economic impact of those productions.

The Oklahoma Film and Music Office shall submit an annual 4 D. 5 report to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate prior to July 1 of each 6 year regarding the activities of the Office. The report shall state 7 the number of filming productions that the Office has helped bring 8 9 to the state and the economic impact of those productions, and 10 provide similar information concerning the efforts of the Office to 11 promote the music industry in this state.

12 E. On the effective date of this act, all administrative rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department 13 regarding the Oklahoma Film and Music Office shall be transferred to 14 15 and become a part of the administrative rules of the Oklahoma 16 Department of Commerce. The Office of Administrative Rules in the Office of the Secretary of State shall provide adequate notice in 17 the Oklahoma Register of the transferred rules and shall place the 18 transferred rules under the Administrative Code section of the 19 Oklahoma Department of Commerce. On the effective date of this act, 20 any amendment, repeal or addition to the transferred rules shall be 21 under the rulemaking authority of the Oklahoma Department of 22 23 Commerce. The Department of Commerce may enact rules to administer 24 programs within the Oklahoma Film and Music Office.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 3623, as
 amended by Section 2, Chapter 313, O.S.L. 2019 (68 O.S. Supp. 2020,
 Section 3623), is amended to read as follows:

Section 3623. As used in the Compete with Canada Film Act: 4 5 1. "Crew" means any person who works on preproduction, principal photography, and postproduction, with the exception of 6 7 producers, principal cast, screenwriters, and the director. The qualifying salary of producers, principal cast, screenwriters, and 8 9 the director, also known as "above-the-line personnel", may be 10 included as crew if the salaries are paid to loan-out corporations and limited liability companies registered to do business in the 11 12 State of Oklahoma or the salaries are paid to Oklahoma-based abovethe-line personnel. The qualifying salary of above-the-line 13 personnel shall not comprise more than twenty-five percent (25%) of 14 15 total expenditures as defined in paragraph 2 of this section. For purposes of this paragraph, "Oklahoma-based" means a company or 16 individual with an Oklahoma income tax requirement; 17

18 2. "Expenditure" or "production cost" includes but is not 19 limited to:

a. wages or salaries of persons who are residents of this
state and who have earned income from working on a
film in this state, including payments to personal
services corporations with respect to the services of

1		qualified performing artists, as determined under
2		Section 62(a)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code,
3	b.	the cost of construction and operations, wardrobe,
4		accessories and related services,
5	с.	the cost of photography, sound synchronization,
6		lighting and related services,
7	d.	the cost of editing and related services,
8	e.	rental of facilities and equipment,
9	f.	other direct costs of producing a film, and
10	g.	the wages and salaries of persons who are defined and
11		registered as an Oklahoma Expatriate by the <del>Office of</del>
12		the Oklahoma Film and Music Commission Oklahoma Film
13		and Music Office within the Oklahoma Department of
14		Commerce;

3. "Film" means a professional single media, multimedia program 15 or feature, which is not child pornography as defined in subsection 16 A of Section 1024.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes or obscene 17 material as defined in paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 1024.1 18 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, including, but not limited to, 19 national advertising messages that are broadcast on a national 20 affiliate or cable network, fixed on film or digital video, which 21 can be viewed or reproduced and which is exhibited in theaters, 22 licensed for exhibition by individual television stations, groups of 23

1 stations, networks, cable television stations or other means or 2 licensed for home viewing markets;

4. "High impact production" means a production for which total
expenditures or production costs are equal to or greater than Fifty
Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), with at least one-third (1/3) of
total costs deemed Oklahoma expenditures by the Office of the
Oklahoma Film and Music Commission Oklahoma Film and Music Office;
and

9 5. "Production company" means a person or company who produces
10 film for exhibition in theaters, on television or elsewhere.
11 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 3624, as
12 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 313, O.S.L. 2019 (68 O.S. Supp.

13 2020, Section 3624), is amended to read as follows:

Section 3624. A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Film 14 15 Enhancement Rebate Program. A rebate in the amount of up to seventeen percent (17%) of documented expenditures made in Oklahoma 16 directly attributable to the production of a film, television 17 production, or television commercial, as defined in Section 3623 of 18 this title, in this state, may be paid to the production company 19 responsible for the production. Provided, for documented 20 expenditures made after July 1, 2009, the rebate amount shall be 21 thirty-five percent (35%), except as provided in subsection B of 22 this section. 23

B. The amount of rebate paid to the production company as
provided for in subsection A of this section shall be increased by
an additional two percent (2%) of documented expenditures if a
production company spends at least Twenty Thousand Dollars
(\$20,000.00) for the use of music created by an Oklahoma resident
that is recorded in Oklahoma or for the cost of recording songs or
music in Oklahoma for use in the production.

C. The rebate program shall be administered by the Office of
the Oklahoma Film and Music Commission Oklahoma Film and Music
Office within the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Oklahoma
Tax Commission, as provided in the Compete with Canada Film Act.

12 D. To be eligible for a rebate payment:

The production company responsible for a film, television 13 1. production, or television commercial, as defined in Section 3623 of 14 15 this title, made in this state shall submit documentation to the 16 Office of the Oklahoma Film and Music Commission Oklahoma Film and Music Office of the amount of wages paid for employment in this 17 state to residents of this state directly relating to the production 18 and the amount of other production costs incurred in this state 19 directly relating to the production; 20

21 2. The production company has filed or will file any Oklahoma
 22 tax return or tax document which may be required by law;
 23 3. Except major studio productions, the production company
 24 shall provide the name of the completion guarantor and a copy of the

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bond guaranteeing the completion of the project or if a film has not secured a completion bond, the production company shall provide evidence that all Oklahoma crew and local vendors have been paid and there are no liens against the production company pending in the state;

4. The minimum budget for the film shall be Fifty Thousand
Dollars (\$50,000.00) of which not less than Twenty-five Thousand
Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be expended in this state;

9 5. The production company shall provide evidence of financing
10 for production prior to the commencement of principal photography;
11 and

12 6. The production company shall provide evidence of a 13 certificate of general liability insurance with a minimum coverage 14 of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and a workers' compensation 15 policy pursuant to state law, which shall include coverage of 16 employer's liability.

A production company shall not be eligible to receive both a 17 Ε. rebate payment pursuant to the provisions of this act Section 3621 18 et seq. of this title and an exemption from sales taxes pursuant to 19 the provisions of paragraph 23 of Section 1357 of this title. If a 20 production company has received such an exemption from sales taxes 21 and submits a claim for rebate pursuant to the provisions of the 22 Compete with Canada Film Act, the company shall be required to fully 23 repay the amount of the exemption to the Tax Commission. A claim 24

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for a rebate shall include documentation from the Tax Commission that repayment has been made as required herein or shall include an affidavit from the production company that the company has not received an exemption from sales taxes pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 21 of Section 1357 of this title.

The Office shall approve or disapprove all claims for rebate 6 F. and shall notify the Tax Commission. The Tax Commission shall, upon 7 notification of approval from the Office of the Film and Music 8 9 Commission Oklahoma Film and Music Office, issue payment for all 10 approved claims from funds in the Oklahoma Film Enhancement Rebate 11 Program Revolving Fund created in Section 3625 of this title. 12 Excluding any rebate payments to high impact productions as provided for in subsection G of this section, the amount of payments in any 13 single fiscal year shall not exceed Eight Million Dollars 14 15 (\$8,000,000.00). If the amount of approved claims exceeds the amount specified in this subsection in a fiscal year, payments shall 16 be made in the order in which the claims are approved by the Office. 17 If an approved claim is not paid in whole or in part, the unpaid 18 claim or unpaid portion may be paid in the following fiscal year 19 subject to the limitations specified in this subsection. 20

G. 1. At the time the Office of the Film and Music Commission
 Oklahoma Film and Music Office issues a conditional prequalification
 for a production, such prequalification may include a proposed

designation as a high impact production, as defined in Section 3623
 of this title.

3 2. The proposed designation must be approved by the Cabinet
4 Secretary for Commerce and Tourism.

3. If the high impact production otherwise meets all of the
requirements of the Compete With with Canada Act and the Office
gives final approval to rebate claims, such rebate claims shall not
be subject to the Eight Million Dollar (\$8,000,000.00) cap provided
for in subsection F of this section.

4. The payment of a rebate claim approved by the Office for a
 production designated as a high impact production by the Cabinet
 Secretary may be made as follows:

- a. by special appropriation to the Oklahoma Film
  Enhancement Rebate Program Revolving Fund, if the
  claim is approved during a regular or special session
  of the Oklahoma Legislature, or
- b. by payment from the Oklahoma Quick Action Closing Fund
  pursuant to Section 48.2 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
  Statues, if the claim is approved when the Oklahoma
  Legislature is not in session.

21 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 500.18, as 22 last amended by Section 10, Chapter 269, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 23 2020, Section 500.18), is amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 500.18. A. Except for members of the Legislature, the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor, provisions of Sections 500.1 2 3 through 500.18 of this title shall be mandatory for all officials and employees of all departments, boards, commissions and 4 5 institutions of the state, regardless of the provisions of any other act of the Legislature, except as provided by this section. 6 The 7 enactment of any measure in the future providing for travel reimbursement of state officers and employees on the basis of 8 9 "actual and necessary" expenses or in any other manner inconsistent 10 with Sections 500.1 through 500.18 of this title shall be deemed to provide for reimbursement in accordance with Sections 500.1 through 11 12 500.18 of this title unless a contrary intent is explicitly expressed in this section. Sections 500.1 through 500.18 of this 13 title shall not apply, however, to travel reimbursements made by 14 15 political subdivisions of this state, except as otherwise provided 16 by law.

B. The agencies listed below are authorized certain exceptions
and/or exemptions to the provisions of Sections 500.1 through 500.18
of this title to the extent specified:

 Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry:
 a. The actual and reasonable expenses of travel and subsistence in pursuing and developing markets for
 Oklahoma agricultural products incurred by the Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner and such employees

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1 designated by the State Board of Agriculture within 2 the marketing development programs of the Oklahoma 3 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall be reimbursed to the employee incurring such expenses. 4 5 Reimbursement of such expenses shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the Board. Expenses claimed 6 shall, prior to reimbursement, be reviewed by the 7 Board at a regular meeting and individually approved 8 9 or disapproved.

10b.The actual and necessary expenses of out-of-state11travel and subsistence incurred by employees of the12Forestry Division authorized to evaluate and acquire13federal excess property or surplus property in other14states for use in its fire protection program, shall15be reimbursed to the employee incurring such expenses.

16 2. Department of Public Safety:

When traveling with the Governor or at the Governor's request, personnel assigned by the Commissioner for executive security and pilots on executive assignment shall be allowed their actual and necessary traveling expenses, upon claims approved by the Commissioner.

22 3. Department of Corrections:

23 The Department of Corrections shall be exempt from limitations 24 of reimbursement for rented automobiles, as set forth in Section

 Transportation Officer for the limited purpose of transporting
 inmates. Reimbursement for the expense shall be on the basis of
 actual cost.

4. Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department:

The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission and Department 6 staff who promote in-state and out-of-state business for Oklahoma's 7 state-operated or state-owned parks, lodges, and golf courses and 8 9 the tourism and recreation industry, may be reimbursed for the 10 actual and necessary expense of travel, subsistence and 11 entertainment for this purpose. The Director of the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department may reimburse the Publisher of 12 13 Oklahoma Today magazine and its staff for expenses for meals and other entertainment in order to gain advertising and promotion for 14 Oklahoma Today magazine. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation 15 16 Department may reimburse the Director of the Office of the Oklahoma 17 Film and Music Commission and staff for the actual and necessary expenses for meals and other entertainment in order to promote the 18 film and music industries in this state. Reimbursement of all 19 20 actual and necessary expenses shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission. 21 5. Oklahoma Department of Commerce: 22 The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the 23 a.

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Director and other employees of the Department

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authorized by the Director for the purpose of business recruitment shall be reimbursed. Reimbursement of expenses shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. Expenses claimed shall, prior to reimbursement, be reviewed by the Director and individually approved or disapproved.

b. The Department, at the discretion of the Director, may 8 9 charter aircraft for the purposes of carrying out its 10 duties and responsibilities related to business recruitment and performing the duties of the Director. 11 12 The cost of such charter shall be exempt from the 13 provisions of Section 500.6 of this title. Claims filed with the Office of Management and Enterprise 14 Services shall bear the following certification: 15 The best interests of the citizens of Oklahoma were 16 better served in that conventional ground 17 transportation was not practical or feasible for this 18 trip, aircraft from the Department of Public Safety 19 were not available for this trip, and no other claim 20 has been or will be filed as a payment for the cost of 21 transportation in connection with this trip. 22 23 The Oklahoma Department of Commerce may reimburse the с.

Oklahoma Film and Music Office staff for the actual

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1 and necessary expenses for meals and other 2 entertainment in order to promote the film and music 3 industries in this state. Reimbursement of all actual 4 and necessary expenses shall be in accordance with 5 rules adopted by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. 6. Office of Management and Enterprise Services: 6 The actual and necessary expenses of travel and subsistence 7 incurred by the Director, any state employee approved by his or her 8 9 appointing authority, or state officials, for travel outside the 10 state in performance of duties related to bond financing shall be 11 reimbursed to the employee or state official incurring such 12 expenses. Reimbursement for lodging expenses shall be supported by three telephone bids from hotels within a reasonable distance of the 13

14 activity for which the travel was approved.

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7. Oklahoma Futures:

16 The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the members of 17 Oklahoma Futures in the performance of their duties shall be 18 reimbursed to the members incurring such expenses. Reimbursement of 19 all actual and necessary expenses shall be in accordance with rules 20 adopted by Oklahoma Futures.

21 8. Oklahoma Development Finance Authority:

The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the members and employees of the Oklahoma Development Finance Authority in the performance of their duties shall be reimbursed to the person

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incurring such expenses. Reimbursement of all actual and necessary
 expenses shall be in accordance with the bylaws of the Authority.

3 9. Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and4 Technology:

5 The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the members and 6 employees of the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and 7 Technology in the performance of their duties shall be reimbursed to 8 the person incurring such expenses. Reimbursement of all actual and 9 necessary expenses shall be in accordance with the bylaws of the 10 Center.

11 10. Center for International Trade Development:

12 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and subsistence incurred by the Director and authorized employees of the 13 Center for International Trade Development for performance of their 14 15 duties for the purpose of business recruitment and assistance shall be reimbursed to the person incurring such expenses. Reimbursement 16 of such expenses shall be in accordance with the rules adopted by 17 the Director of the Center for International Trade Development. 18 Expenses claimed shall be reviewed and individually approved or 19 disapproved, prior to reimbursement, first by the Director, and 20 finally by either the Vice President, Business and Finance of 21 Oklahoma State University or the President of Oklahoma State 22 University. 23

24 11. Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation:

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1 The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Director and other employees of the Bureau authorized by the Director as a result 2 of conducting investigations shall be reimbursed to each such 3 employee incurring the expenses. Reimbursement of the expenses 4 5 shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. Prior to reimbursement, 6 expenses claimed shall be reviewed by the Director and individually 7 approved or disapproved. 8

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12. Department of Human Services:

10 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging a. and subsistence incurred by employees of the Legal 11 Division in the performance of their duties for the 12 purpose of representing the Department of Human 13 Services or any of its officials, employees, 14 institutions or hospitals at any proceeding, including 15 depositions, held before any court, administrative 16 body or representative thereof, shall be reimbursed to 17 the employee incurring such expenses. Expenses 18 claimed shall be approved by the General Counsel and 19 the Director of Human Services prior to reimbursement. 20 b. The Department, at the discretion of the Director, may 21 charter aircraft when determined by the Director such 22 charter would be more practical or less expensive than 23 normal modes of transportation and when aircraft of 24

the Department of Public Safety are unavailable. The costs of such charter shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 500.6 of this title.

13. Oklahoma Health Care Authority:

5 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and subsistence incurred by employees of the Legal Division in the 6 performance of their duties for the purpose of representing the 7 Authority or any of its officials or employees, at any proceeding, 8 9 including depositions, held before any court, administrative body or 10 representative thereof, shall be reimbursed to the employee 11 incurring such expenses. Expenses claimed shall be approved by the 12 Administrator prior to reimbursement.

13 14. Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs14 Control:

The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Director and 15 other employees of the Bureau authorized by the Director as a result 16 of conducting investigations shall be reimbursed to each employee 17 incurring the expenses. Reimbursement of the expenses shall be in 18 accordance with rules adopted by the Director of the Oklahoma State 19 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control. Prior to 20 reimbursement, expenses claimed shall be reviewed by the Director 21 and individually approved or disapproved. 22

23 15. University Hospitals:

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1 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and 2 subsistence incurred by employees of the Legal Office in the 3 performance of their duties for the purpose of representing the University Hospitals or any of its officials, employees, 4 5 institutions or hospitals at any proceeding  $\tau$  including depositions, held before any court, administrative body or representative 6 thereof, shall be reimbursed to the employee incurring such 7 expenses. Expenses shall be approved by the Chief Executive Officer 8 9 of the University Hospitals or by the University Hospitals 10 Authority.

11 16. Oklahoma Historical Society:

12 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, subsistence and entertainment incurred by the Executive Director, Deputy Director 13 and any employees designated by the Executive Committee of the 14 Oklahoma Historical Society Board of Directors in pursuing and 15 developing programs and projects for the preservation and marketing 16 of Oklahoma history shall be reimbursed to the person incurring the 17 expenses. Reimbursement of expenses shall be in accordance with 18 rules adopted by the Oklahoma Historical Society Board of Directors. 19 Prior to reimbursement, expenses claimed shall be reviewed by the 20 Executive Committee at a regularly scheduled meeting and each claim 21 shall be individually approved or disapproved. 22

23 17. The Oklahoma Department of Mines:

1 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and subsistence incurred by employees of the Department in the 2 3 performance of their duties for the purpose of representing the Department or any of its officials or employees, at any proceeding, 4 5 hearing or meeting with federal agencies, boards, commissions, congressional representatives, congressional committees or staff, 6 shall be reimbursed to the employee incurring such expenses. 7 Expenses claimed shall be approved by the Executive Director prior 8 9 to reimbursement.

10 18. The Office of Attorney General:

11 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and 12 subsistence incurred by its employees in the performance of their duties for the purpose of representing the state, the Legislature, 13 any state board, agency or commission, or any employee or official 14 15 of the state entitled to representation, at any proceeding, including depositions, held before any court, administrative body or 16 any representative thereof, and the actual and necessary expenses 17 incurred by employees as a result of conducting investigations shall 18 be reimbursed to the employee incurring the expenses. The expenses 19 shall be approved by the Attorney General prior to reimbursement. 20

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19. District Attorneys Council:

The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and subsistence incurred by each district attorney and other employees of the district attorney authorized by the district attorney in the

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1 performance of their duties for any district other than the district 2 for which they are employed for the purpose of representing the 3 state, any county, or any employee or official of the state entitled to representation at any proceeding  $\tau$  including depositions held 4 5 before any court, administrative body or any representative of a court or administrative body, and the actual and necessary expenses 6 incurred as a result of conducting investigations shall be 7 reimbursed to each employee incurring the expenses. Reimbursement 8 9 of the expenses shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the 10 District Attorneys Council. Prior to reimbursement, expenses 11 claimed shall be reviewed by the Council and individually approved 12 or disapproved.

13 20. The Department of Securities:

The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging and 14 15 subsistence incurred by the Administrator and other employees of the Department of Securities in the performance of their duties for the 16 purpose of representing the Department of Securities, at any 17 proceeding, including depositions, held before any court, 18 administrative body or any representative thereof, conducting on-19 site examinations, or conducting investigations, shall be reimbursed 20 to each employee incurring the expenses. The expenses shall be 21 approved by the Administrator of the Department of Securities prior 22 to reimbursement. 23

24 21. Corporation Commission:

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The actual and necessary travel expenses incurred by the staff of the Public Utility Division as a result of conducting audits and/or reviews of utility service providers shall be reimbursed to each such employee incurring the expense. Reimbursement of the sexpenses shall be as set forth in procedures established by the appointing authority.

7 22. The Department of Human Services:

8 Employees of the Department of Human Services shall be 9 reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses of travel, 10 lodging and subsistence incurred in the performance of their duties 11 for the purpose of escorting and transporting children or adults in 12 the care or custody of the Department:

- a. for out-of-state visitation, care, treatment and
  placement of a child welfare client,
- b. for out-of-state treatment for or placement of an
  adult protective services client,
- 17 c. for out-of-state treatment for or placement of a
  18 resident of a state resource center, or
- d. for out-of-state treatment for or placement of an
  individual with a developmental disability who is
  living in the community in community residential
  services.

23 Expenses claimed shall be approved by the appropriate Division24 Administrator or Associate Director prior to reimbursement.

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23. The Banking Department:

The actual and necessary expenses of travel and lodging incurred by the Commissioner and other employees of the Banking Department in the performance of their duties for the Banking Department shall be paid or reimbursed by the Banking Department to each employee incurring the expenses. The expenses shall be approved by the Banking Commissioner prior to payment or reimbursement.

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24. Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security:

9 The actual and necessary expenses of travel, lodging, and 10 subsistence incurred by the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director, as 11 a result of the duties and responsibilities of the Director, shall 12 be paid or reimbursed by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security.

13 25. The Grand River Dam Authority:

The actual and necessary expenses of travel and lodging incurred by the Board of Directors and other employees of the district in the performance of their duties for the Grand River Dam Authority shall be paid or reimbursed by the district to each Director or employee incurring the expenses. The expenses shall be approved by the General Manager of the Grand River Dam Authority prior to payment or reimbursement.

26. The Native American Cultural and Educational Authority:
 The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Directors and
 employees of the Native American Cultural and Educational Authority

in performances of duties. The expenses shall be approved by the
 Director prior to payment or reimbursement.

3 Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education: 27. The actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Director and 4 5 other employees of the Department, authorized by the Director, for the purpose of business recruitment, training, and the provision of 6 technical assistance shall be reimbursed. Reimbursement of expenses 7 shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the State Board of 8 9 Career and Technology Education. Expenses claimed, prior to the 10 reimbursement, will be reviewed by the Board and individually 11 approved or disapproved.

C. The agencies listed in subsection B of this section shall be required to report annually the actual expenses excepted or exempted from Sections 500.1 through 500.18 of this title to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report shall be submitted no later than the first day of September following the end of each fiscal year.

19 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 20 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services is hereby directed to coordinate the transfer of employees, funds, allotments, purchase orders and outstanding financial obligations of
