| 10 | certain request for proposal; stating purpose; authorizing OMES to enter into contract; establishing |
| 11 | procedure for providing notice and for awarding contract; requiring certain state entities to use |
| 12 | vendor selected by OMES; encouraging state court system to use contracted vendor; amending 10A O.S. |
| 13 | 2021, Section 1-8-109, which relates to process for conducting background checks; requiring compliance |
| 14 | with state law; and providing an effective date. |
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| 16 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: |
| 17 | SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 10001, is |
| 18 | amended to read as follows: |
| 19 | Section 10001. A. By December 31, 2022, the Director of the |
| 20 | Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) shall initiate a |
| 21 | request for proposal for a third-party vendor to perform background |
| 22 | checks on behalf of all state agencies, boards, commissions, higher |
| 23 | education institutions, career technology, or common education |
| 24 27 | institutions. The purpose of this request for proposal is to |

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| 1 | standardize the background check process for state employees and |
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| 2 | private sector partners who contract with the state. OMES is |
| 3 | authorized to enter into a contract for such services, pursuant to |
| 4 | the provisions of law. |
| 5 | B. Notice of the request for proposal shall be published in the |
| 6 | manner provided for competitive bidding. The contract shall be |
| 7 | awarded to the responsible offeror whose proposal is determined to |
| 8 | achieve the desired goal of standardization of the background check |
| 9 | process for the state. |
| 10 | C. Any agency, board, commission, higher education institution, |
| 11 | career technology or common education institution shall contract |
| 12 | with the third-party vendor who is selected by OMES to perform |
| 13 | background checks. The state court system is encouraged to use the |
| 14 | third-party vendor to perform background checks. |
| 15 | D. Any agency, board, commission, higher education institution, |
| 16 | career technology or common education institution may contract with |
| 17 | a third-party vendor who is a member in good standing with the |
| 18 | National Association of Professional Background Screeners to perform |
| 19 | any and all employment screenings, background checks and credit |
| 20 | checks. |
| 21 | E. The Director shall promulgate rules and establish procedures |
| 22 | to implement the request for proposal pursuant to this section. |
| 23 | SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 10A O.S. 2021, Section 1-8-109, is |
| 24 2 - | amended to read as follows: |

| 1 | Section 1-8-109. A. Unless prohibited by state or federal law, |
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| 2 | the Department shall develop, where feasible, an agency-wide process |
| 3 | for conducting background checks, fingerprinting, and personal care |
| 4 | applications. Any background checks conducted shall be in |
| 5 | compliance with Section 1 of this act. |
| 6 | B. The Department shall maintain limits on the number of |
| 7 | children a person is authorized to care for; however, a person shall |
| 8 | be permitted to provide multiple services where authorized. |
| 9 | SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022. |
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
