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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 332, O.S.L.
17	2019 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 11-103.6m), is amended to read as
18	follows:
19	Section 11-103.6m. A. The State Department of Education shall
20	develop by December 31, 2019, a rubric for computer science programs
21	in elementary, middle and high schools to serve as a guide to
22	schools for implementing quality computer science programs.
23	B. The rubric shall include but not be limited to the following
24 27	recommendations:

1 1. No less than one computer science course taught by a teacher with a computer science certification at each school site, which may include core content courses where computer science concepts are integrated; and

Allowing all students to have access to career exploration
activities that address how computer science skills are utilized.

C. <u>1. Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, all public high</u>
schools and public charter high schools in this state shall offer a
minimum of one computer science course to students.

10 <u>2. Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, all public middle</u> 11 <u>schools and public charter middle schools in this state shall offer</u> 12 <u>instruction in exploratory computer science content.</u>

¹³ <u>3. Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, all public</u> ¹⁴ <u>elementary schools and public charter elementary schools shall offer</u> ¹⁵ <u>instruction in the basics of computer science content and</u> ¹⁶ computational thinking.

17 <u>D.</u> Each course or offering required by subsection C of this 18 section shall be:

19 <u>1. Be</u> aligned to the Oklahoma Academic Standards for Computer 20 Science and current research-based instructional practices;

21 <u>2. Be of high quality, as defined by the State Board of</u> 22 <u>Education; and</u> 23

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1	3. Be offered in an in-person setting or as a virtual or
2	distance course option only when a traditional classroom setting is
3	not feasible.
4	D. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to
5	mean that courses may not be taught in a virtual, distance,
6	integrated or other innovative setting.
7	E. By June 30, 2025, and by June 30 each year thereafter, each
8	school district and public charter school shall submit to the State
9	Department of Education a report regarding computer science courses
10	or content offered during the previous school year. The report
11	shall include:
12	1. The names and course codes of computer science courses
13	offered in each school including a course description and which
14	Oklahoma Academic Standards for Computer Science are covered, to the
15	extent such information is available;
16	2. The number and percentage of students who enrolled in each
17	computer science course disaggregated by:
18	<u>a.</u> gender,
19	b. race and ethnicity,
20	c. special education status including whether a student
21	is on an individualized education program pursuant to
22	the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)
23	or a Section 504 Plan as defined by the Rehabilitation
24	Act of 1973, P.L. No. 93-112,

1	d. eligibility for free or reduced-price meals under the
2	National School Lunch Act, and
3	e. grade level; and
4	3. The number of computer science teachers at each school
5	disaggregated by:
6	<u>a.</u> gender,
7	b. race and ethnicity,
8	c. highest academic degree attained, and
9	d. subject area of teacher certification, if applicable.
10	F. The State Department of Education shall post on its website
11	the reports received pursuant to subsection E of this section.
12	1. Information submitted pursuant to paragraphs 1 and 2 of
13	subsection E of this section shall be disaggregated by school prior
14	to being posted online; and
15	2. Information submitted pursuant to paragraph 3 of subsection
16	E of this section shall be posted online in aggregate statewide
17	form.
18	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
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
