9 Red Day at the Oklahoma Capitol.

12 WHEREAS, cardiovascular disease is the number one killer of
13 women in the United States; and

14 WHEREAS, cardiovascular disease kills one woman almost every
15 eighty (80) seconds in the United States; and

16 WHEREAS, heart disease and stroke can affect all women at any
17 age; and

18 WHEREAS, heart attacks are on the rise in younger generations of
19 women, who are less likely to be aware of the warning signs of heart
20 attacks and strokes; and

21 WHEREAS, cardiovascular disease kills one in three women but
22 nearly eighty percent (80%) of cardiac events are preventable
23 through education and lifestyle changes; and

1 WHEREAS, all women are encouraged to move more, to eat smart,
2 and to manage their blood pressure to reduce the risk of
3 cardiovascular disease; and

4 WHEREAS, the American Heart Association's Go Red for Women
5 movement motivates women to learn their family history and to meet
6 with a health care provider to determine their risk for
7 cardiovascular disease and stroke; and

8 WHEREAS, as the trusted, passionate, and relevant force for
9 change to eradicate heart disease and stroke in women, the American
10 Heart Association's Go Red for Women movement remains steadfast and
11 committed to meeting the comprehensive health needs of women at
12 every life stage; and

13 WHEREAS, by increasing awareness, speaking out about heart
14 disease, and empowering women to reduce their risk for
15 cardiovascular disease we can save thousands of lives each year.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
17 OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
