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### COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to education; specifying apportionment of certain appropriated funds; providing for the budgeting of funds in certain categories and amounts; requiring development of certain performance measures; requiring transfers of certain funds; limiting authority to reduce certain apportionments; requiring certain funds to be expended for certain purposes; stating purposes for allocated funds; requiring certain transfer of funds; stating legislative intent regarding expenditures for direct costs; prohibiting the State Department of Education from contracting for certain administrative costs in certain program; providing for duties and compensation of employees of the State Department of Education; requiring the reduction or withholding of State Aid funds for certain purposes; authorizing the State Board of Education to request transfer of certain funds; authorizing the request of early allocations for certain funds; requiring proportional reductions of allocations under certain conditions; authorizing exemption from budgetary limits for unanticipated federal funds; providing procedures; requiring approval of exemption request under certain conditions; requiring budgeting of certain funds in certain years; providing lapse dates; requiring certain budgeting procedures; and prohibiting certain budgeting procedures.

4	SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, the

15	SECTION 3. The funds appropriated in Sections 13 and 14 of
16	Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma
17	Legislature in the amount of Three Million Eight Hundred Twenty-
18	seven Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$3,827,899.00)
19	shall be transferred to the School Consolidation Assistance Fund.
20	SECTION 4. The funds appropriated in Sections 15 and 16 of
21	Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma
22	Legislature in the amount of Three Million Eight Hundred Twenty-
23	seven Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$3,827,899.00)
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shall be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System Dedicated
Revenue Revolving Fund.

- SECTION 5. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act specifically for the purpose of funding the Teachers' Retirement Credit shall be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma.
- SECTION 6. If the funds allocated in Section 1 of this act specifically for the purpose of funding the Teachers' Retirement Credit are insufficient to fully fund the employee contribution credits provided for in Section 17-108.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes as invoiced by the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma, the Department may reduce in equal proportions funds allocated in Section 1 of this act to Education Leadership Oklahoma, Advanced Placement Incentives, Reading Sufficiency, Teacher and Leader Effectiveness Programs, Alternative and High Challenge Education, Required Assessments, Ag in the Classroom and Imagine Math. Total amount of funds reduced shall not exceed the additional amount required to fully fund the employee contribution credits.
- SECTION 7. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for the purpose of funding Education Leadership Oklahoma shall be expended as follows:
- 1. One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00)

  shall be transferred to the Oklahoma National Board Certification

  Revolving Fund created in Section 6-204.4 of Title 70 of the

- Oklahoma Statutes for the purpose of awarding annual bonuses as directed; and
- 2. Three Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,300,000.00)

  4 shall be transferred to the Oklahoma School Psychologist, Speech
  5 language Pathologist, and Audiologist National Certification

  6 Revolving Fund created in Section 6-206.1 of Title 70 of the

- SECTION 8. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Advanced Placement Incentives shall be expended for the purpose of providing assistance for students in financial need, grants to districts wanting to start new AP programs and expand professional development, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1210.703 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- SECTION 9. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Reading Sufficiency shall be expended pursuant to the provisions of Section 1210.508D of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- SECTION 10. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Teacher and Leader Effectiveness shall be expended for the purpose of improving the effectiveness of teachers and leaders in the public school system through continued development, pursuant to Section 6-101.16 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- SECTION 11. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Required Assessments shall be expended for the purpose of

administering a statewide student assessment system for grades three through eight and in high school, pursuant to Section 1210.508 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 12. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Alternative and High Challenge Education shall be expended for the purpose of operating the statewide system of alternative education programs as provided in Section 1210.568 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and for encouraging school districts to participate in innovative alternative education programs.

SECTION 13. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for the Teacher Induction Program shall be expended pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-195 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 14. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for Early Intervention shall be transferred to the Early Intervention Fund 250. It is the intent of the Legislature that funding available for SoonerStart Early Intervention Services be expended for direct services to eligible infants, toddlers and their families. The State Department of Education shall not contract, pay or reimburse for administrative cost recovery personnel, accounting and management information system costs, maintenance and operations at the state or local level or indirect costs which do not comply with the requirements of Section 13-125 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 15. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for the Early Childhood Initiative shall be expended for the purpose of funding the early childhood program pursuant to the provisions of Section 10-105.4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 16. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Department of Education by law shall be set by the State Board of Education.

SECTION 17. State Aid funds shall be reduced or withheld by the State Board of Education in an amount necessary to ensure compliance with the provisions of this act.

SECTION 18. The State Board of Education is authorized to request the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to transfer appropriated funds to the appropriate dispensing fund.

SECTION 19. The Superintendent of the State Board of Education may request through the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the Education Reform Revolving Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Board's disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

SECTION 20. If funds appropriated in Sections 1 through 16 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature are not sufficient to fully fund the provisions of this act, each school district which qualifies for funds, excluding Financial Support of

Public Schools, pursuant to the provisions of this act shall take a proportionate reduction.

SECTION 21. A. The Superintendent of the State Board of Education may request, in the manner provided in this section, that receipt and expenditure of unanticipated federal funds awarded after July 1, 2021, be exempt from expenditure limitations and from budgetary limitations.

- 1. The Superintendent shall make a request for exemption to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services in writing and file a revised budget program.
- 2. The Superintendent shall also file copies of the request for exemption and budget work program revisions with the House of Representatives Appropriations and Budget Committee Chair and the Senate Appropriations Committee Chair. The House Appropriations and Budget Committee Chair and/or the Senate Appropriations Committee Chair shall notify the Office of Management and Enterprise Services of any noncompliance of the request with legislative intent within twelve (12) calendar days of their receipt of the exemption request.
- B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall approve the request for exemption unless both the Chair and Vice Chair of the Joint Legislative Committee on Budget and Program Oversight provide written notification to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services within twelve (12) calendar days of the Committee's receipt of the exemption request that the exemption

subverts the intention and objectives of the Legislature in establishing the original limit. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall give written notice of approval or disapproval of each exemption to the agency, the Governor, the Chair of the House Appropriations and Budget Committee and the Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee within eighteen (18) calendar days of receiving the request.

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SECTION 22. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (hereafter FY-22) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 (hereafter FY-23). Funds budgeted for FY-22 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2022, and must be expended by November 15, 2022. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2022, and not budgeted for FY-23, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-23 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2023. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2023, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-22, and not required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-23, after the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds

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from the FY-22 budget work program and after such revision has been
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    approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
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
