## **Research Analysis**

According to the 2020 Federal Decennial Census, Oklahoma's statewide population is 3,959,353 making the ideal district population for each state House district 39,202. HB1001X updates the State House of Representatives Redistricting Act of 2021 to divide the 101 state House districts accordingly. The measure repeals the district descriptions that were based on the Census Bureau's 2015-2019 American Community Survey population estimates.

The new district boundaries will take effect on the 15th day following the General Election in November 2022. The State Election Board must conduct regular and special elections for state House districts held after April 5, 2022 in accordance with the act. To file as a candidate for a House district in 2022, a person must have been a registered voter and resident of the district no later than December 31, 2021.
