**Research Analysis**

HB1002X creates the Oklahoma Congressional Redistricting Act of 2021 and divides the state into five congressional districts. According to the 2020 Federal Decennial Census, Oklahoma's statewide population is 3,959,353. Congressional district 1, 2 and 3 will have a population of 791,871 whereas Congressional district 4 and 5 will have a population of 791,870.

The new district boundaries will not affect the operation of any board, commission or other entity whose membership is based upon previous congressional district boundaries created by law. The new boundaries take effect at the beginning of the terms of the members of the U.S. House of Representatives elected at the General Election in November 2022. The State Election Board must conduct elections in 2022 in accordance with the act. The measure also repeals the Oklahoma Congressional Redistricting Act of 2011.
