**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1011 requires the Attorney General's office to prosecute violators of the measure under the Consumer Protection Act. The Attorney General's office currently funds only a small portion of its' Consumer Protection Department by State appropriations, while the majority is funded by a revolving fund or other sources. Therefore, given the various sources of funding, and the unknown number of cases that the Attorney General's office may prosecute under this measure, it is currently indeterminable if, or how much appropriations the Attorney General's office may need. If the number of cases the Attorney General's office pursues is high, then additional appropriations may be needed to fund those cases. Therefore, the State's budget and appropriations may see an impact in the future, depending on the number of cases prosecuted by the Attorney General.
