**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB1027 requires the State Board of Education and Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, in collaboration with school district superintendents, to develop and offer training for school employees on violence de-escalation. The training shall include information about trauma-informed teaching, self-regulation practices for students and staff, and trauma-informed response protocols for addressing behavior with compassionate approaches.
