Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute for HB1198 creates the State House of Representatives Redistricting Act of 2021.

The measure designates the Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) Five-Year Estimates for 2015-2019 as the best alternative population data available for legislative redistricting and directs the Legislature to use ACS data to draft redistricting legislation.

According to the United States Census Bureau's ACS Five-Year Estimates for 2015-2019, Oklahoma's total population is 3,932,870. For the purposes of redistricting the 101 state House districts, each district should have an ideal population of 38,939 people.
