**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 1236 creates a new law stating that the Oklahoma Legislature may review any federal executive order, federal agency rule or federal legislative action to determine constitutionality. Upon recommendation from the Legislature, the Attorney General will review the action to determine constitutionality. Additionally, a publicly funded organization shall not implement any action that restricts a person's rights or is deemed unconstitutional.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure allows the Legislature to review presidential executive orders, federal agency rules or congressional action to determine constitutionality. The attorney General, upon recommendation from the Legislature, will review any such actions to determine constitutionality. Provision is made for a declaration of constitutionality by a majority vote of the Legislature should the Attorney General decline to pursue action based on Legislative determination.
