**Research Analysis**

HB 1629 declares that any federal, state, county or municipal act, law, executive order, administrative order, court order, rule or regulation ordering the confiscation of firearms, firearm accessories or ammunition from law-abiding citizens of this state is considered an infringement on the rights of citizens to keep and bear arms as guaranteed by the Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States and Article II, Section 26 of the Constitution of Oklahoma. The measure provides that it is the duty of the courts and law enforcement agencies to protect the rights of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms. The measure prohibits law enforcement officers from obeying or enforcing any order which violates the Second Amendment of the Constitution or Article II, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution, or the oath of the law enforcement officer. The measure prohibits any retaliation against a law enforcement officer who refuses to obey or enforce any order which violates the Second Amendment. The measure prohibits the reduction of funding to any county sheriff's office or municipal police department for refusing to obey or enforce an order which violates the Second Amendment of the Constitution or Article II, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution, or the oath of the law enforcement officer or for making any county or municipality a Second Amendment sanctuary county or municipality.
