**Research Analysis**

HB 2007, as introduced, allows a registered apprentice working under the supervision of a mechanical contractor to sit for any journeyman license examination, except the unlimited journeyman license, without satisfying training or experience requirements if the supervising contractor certifies that the apprentice has the necessary skills.

**Fiscal Analysis**

According to Construction Industries Board officials, anticipated software modification cost as a result of this measure range from \$10,000 to \$90,000. If the measure results in additional licenses, it could help offset the costs. The Construction Industries Board is a non-appropriated state agency. HB 2007 in its current form is not expected to have direct fiscal impact on the State budget or appropriations.
