**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB2030 requires the subject matter standards for history, social studies, and U.S. Government to include the study of important historical documents, including the Constitution, Declaration of Independence, Emancipation Proclamation, and Federalist Papers.

Subject matter standards for U.S. Government must include simulations of the democratic process, and lessons on the structure and relationship between national, state, county and local governments.

Lastly, the measure requires high school students to pass the United States naturalization test in order to graduate, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.
