**Research Analysis**

HB 2215 provides that it is unlawful and be considered incitement to riot for a person to obstruct an exit or entrance into a private business or to obstruct any street, road, highway or thoroughfare that is used by the public. The measure provides that a motor vehicle operator who unintentionally causes injury or death to an individual is not criminally or civilly liable if the injury or death occurred while the motor vehicle operator was fleeing from a riot.
