**Fiscal Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB 2401 modifies which felons are prohibited from possessing a firearm by restricting the prohibition to those with a violent felony or 85% crime conviction.

The measure would affect the volume of cases for violations of the existing prohibition on firearm possession. The state could see a decrease in fine revenues and court costs. Such decrease would be offset by a decrease in prosecution costs associated with enforcement of the measure. No overall impact to state revenues or expenditures is anticipated from passage of the measure.
