**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB2627 requires the county assessor to notify the treasurer or chief financial officer of every school district, technology school district, and any other affected district within five days of a protest in value from a taxpayer. After sending the required notification, the county assessor must also notify affected districts of updates in the process including completion of the protest and total amount that will be apportioned.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2627 in its current form requires certain notifications be provided to certain entities by the county assessor.
