**Research Analysis**

The fifth amendment to HB 2646 creates a three-day nonresident medical marijuana patient permit to be available to any nonresident patient licensee. To obtain a permit, nonresident licensees must present a valid patient license and a state-issued identification card to a dispensary, which then must verify the license through an online or phone verification system of the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA), which is directed to maintain and publish a list of states with medical marijuana programs. The cost of the permit is \$75. There is no limit for how many times a person can receive the permit, but they must pay the fee and have their license verified each time they renew it. Permit-holders can obtain no more than a three-day supply of medical marijuana, an amount which shall be determined by OMMA.
