**Research Analysis**

HB3075 provides that any reissued marriage certificate contain the original marriage date and are notated as "reissued" or "amended." The measure also specifies that the name on the marriage certificate may be any combination of either party's names, but the marriage certificate cannot be used to do a full name change. The measure stipulates that once issued, marriage licenses are valid for 30 days and the marriage ceremony must be performed no more than 30 days from issuance. The license and completed marriage certificate must be returned no more than 60 days after issuance. The measure additionally repeals 43 O.S. 2021, [Sections 19](#) and [36](#).
