**Research Analysis**

HB3075 provides that any reissued marriage certificate contain the original marriage date and are notated as "reissued" or "amended." The measure also specifies that the name on the marriage certificate may be any combination of either party's names, but the marriage certificate cannot be used to do a full name change. The measure stipulates that once issued, marriage licenses are valid for 30 days and the marriage ceremony must be performed no more than 30 days from issuance. The license and completed marriage certificate must be returned no more than 30 days after issuance. The measure additionally repeals 43 O.S. 2021, [Sections 19](#) and [36](#).

The Senate amendment to HB3133 changes the requirements for number of days after issuance in which the marriage license and completed marriage certificate must be returned from 60 days to 30 days.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The Senate amendments to the measure would change the deadline for the submission of a marriage license and completed marriage certificate to a court clerk from 60 days to 30 days.

Upon review, the Senate amendments to the measure as passed by the House do not alter the fiscal impact of the measure. No direct fiscal impact to the state is anticipated from passage of the measure.
