**Research Analysis**

HB3129 creates a new law defining "pregnancy expenses" as the sum of a pregnant individual's health insurance premiums that are not paid by an employer or the government and medical costs related to pregnancy. The biological father of the child has a duty to pay 50% of the mother's pregnancy expenses, unless paternity is challenged, which in that case the biological father owes no duty until paternity is established. Any portion of pregnancy expenses paid by either parent lessens that individual's 50% share. Pregnancy expenses may be retroactively collected and awarded and shall be ordered by a court if an individual seeks payment by providing documentation.
