Research Analysis

HB 3208 directs the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) to establish a two-year moratorium on issuing business licenses for dispensaries, processors, and commercial growers beginning August 1, 2022. The moratorium does not apply to licensure renewal or applications received on or before August 1, 2022. The executive director of OMMA may terminate the moratorium at any time if it determines all pending licensing reviews, inspections, or investigations have been completed. Additionally, the measure prohibits change in ownership of a business if the licensee has a current violation that may necessitate revocation, suspension, or nonrenewal of the license.
