**Research Analysis**

HB3364, as introduced, deletes the option to register to vote via telegraph. The measure also outlines the identification requirements for a registered voter applying for an absentee ballot by electronic communication, in person, or by mail.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The State Election Board estimates that HB 3364 would include approximately \$10,000 in programming costs to modify the OK Voter Portal Absentee request functionality and the data entry portal used by County Election Boards to process paper-based absentee requests. In addition, the Board estimates a cost of \$10,000 to redesign, print, and distribute new absentee ballot paper applications. In aggregate, the measure would have a fiscal impact of approximately \$20,000.
