Research Analysis

The PCS to HB 3419 transfers all powers, duties, responsibilities and employees relating to the issuance of driver licenses and motor vehicle license registration from the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety and the Oklahoma Tax Commission to the newly created Service Oklahoma, a division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

Repeals [Title 47, Section 6-107.4](#) relating to Procedure After License or Instruction Permit is Canceled or Denied

Repeals [Title 47, Section 6-107.5](#) relating to Written Request for Hearing before Department of Public Safety

Repeals [Title 47, Section 1140.1](#) relating to Cameras Furnished to Appointed Motor License Agents

The Senate amendments adds the Service Oklahoma Computer Imaging Revolving Fund; Provides for an apportionment of 4-year and 8-year licenses to fund the Service Oklahoma Computer Imaging Revolving Fund;

Fiscal Analysis

There are nine Senate amendments to the measure.

The first amendment would create the Service Oklahoma Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund, and the second through fifth amendments would insert references to this fund in sections allocating fee revenue from driver license and identification card issuance.

Amendment six removes a reference to House and Senate districts.

Amendments seven and eight would restore stricken language relating to duties of the Corporation Commission and the International Registration Plan.

Amendment nine would restore the title to the measure.

Upon review, passage of the measure will likely have a fiscal impact to the state. In consultation with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the measure would require the transfer of approximately \$35,400,000 in Department of Public Safety budget resources to Service

Oklahoma. The Oklahoma Tax Commission would be required to transfer approximately \$21,060,000 in budget resources. An additional \$19,908,000 in appropriations would be required to complete the creation of Service Oklahoma, of which \$18,608,000 are one-time expenditures.

The full FY-2023 budget for Service Oklahoma is expected to be \$76,368,000, according to OMES.
