**Research Analysis**

HB3820, as introduced, provides an exception to the confidentiality requirement for documents acquired through the property valuation protest process. Communications and the sharing of documents between county assessors and boards of equalizations is allowed if the such actions are for the purpose of establishing values of real or personal property throughout the state.
