Research Analysis

HB 4210 requires the Oklahoma Attorney General to maintain data related to human trafficking and to assist law enforcement, social service agencies, and private victim advocacy programs in identifying and supporting victims of human trafficking. The measure creates within the Office of the Attorney General the Human Trafficking Response Unit to maintain data and develop training programs to assist agencies and victims of human trafficking. The Unit is to also create financial incentive programs to encourage state agencies to attend training programs and review policies, expand the eligibility of existing victim services funding and designate targeted funding for victim service organizations. The Unit is to publish public service announcements on various media platforms to educate the public about the dangers of human trafficking.
