Research Analysis

HJR1058, as introduced, would put a constitutional amendment to a public vote that would require any measure referred to the people by an initiative to effect and be in force when it has been approved by a 55% majority of the votes cast. An initiative that only repeals a constitutional provision or provisions or referendum will take effect after being approved by a majority of the vote. The measure includes a ballot title.

HJR 1058 in its current form refers to a vote of the people a proposed amendment to the Constitution. The amendment is not expected to have a direct impact on the state budget or state revenues.
