Research Analysis

SB 1092 allows the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) to create and promulgate rules for a flag flying program. The program enables the people of Oklahoma to request for a certain flag or flags to be flown at the Oklahoma State Capitol building on specific days for commemorative purposes. The measure authorizes OMES to create a fee structure to pay for costs associated with the program such as flag purchases, employee services and certificates. In addition, a \$25 fee per flag flown will be charged and deposited into the Capitol Preservation Fund.

Flags permitted to be flown include:

- The current flag of the United States;
- The current flag of the State of Oklahoma;
- The original (Star and 46) flag of the State of Oklahoma;
- The original 13 Stars and Stripes flag of the United States also known as the Betsy Ross flag;
- The "An Appeal to Heaven" flag flown by General George Washington;
- The Gadsden flag also known as the "Don't Tread On Me" flag;
- The POW/MIA flag;
- The National Guard flag; and
- Any official flag for any branch of the United States Armed Forces.
