**Research Analysis**

The CCS to SB 1522 modifies the definition of "harmful to minors" to include any adult that knowingly gives obscene material to a minor without either direct parental or guardian supervision or informed consent of the minor's guardian or parent, or any adult that knowingly gives obscene material to a vulnerable person, to include, but not be limited to, a person with intellectual or developmental disabilities or a person experiencing homelessness.

The measure also provides that it is unlawful to loiter upon property containing a critical infrastructure facility. The measure defines "loiter" to mean standing or waiting around idly or without apparent or rational purpose. The measure includes within the definition of critical infrastructure, any county-owned property including, but not limited to, courthouses and detention centers.
